Tiger Goldstick Park to receive trail improvements

The City of Edmonton is upgrading a trail in Tiger Goldstick Park with nearly one kilometer of new gravel surfacing, benches, signage and railing.

"The improvement of Goldstick trail is all part of a broader plan to increase public use and access of the river valley," says Rob Marchak, Director of the Strategic Projects Section with the City of Edmonton. "We are so pleased this work is now underway following recent discussions with community stakeholders. Edmonton's river valley is one of our city's greatest assets and this work allows all citizens the opportunity to enjoy it to the fullest."



These projects are part of a larger initiative to promote access to the city's river valley. With funding of nearly \$72.9 million dollars from the River Valley Alliance, the Government of Canada, the Government of Alberta and the City of Edmonton, five major initiatives across the city will increase the ability for the public to use and enjoy the river valley.

The initiatives, all in various stages of development, are scheduled to be completed by November of 2016.

Tiger Goldstick Park is one of 20 River Valley Parks in Edmonton which together form the largest urban park in Canada. It is located at 3910 - 103 Avenue.
