Our Changing City

Edmonton needs more seniors' housing to keep up with demographic changes. The number of people stating their age as 60 and up in the 2014 municipal census was 128,914 (15% of the total population) - a 20% increase since 2009. Our city also has a shortage of housing for seniors on fixed incomes.

Future Seniors' Housing Location

In 2012, City Council approved seniors' housing on the vacant school building site in Wedgewood Heights. The City is exploring moving the approved building site to an alternative building location. Our upcoming open house will share information and seek your feedback about the potential sites.

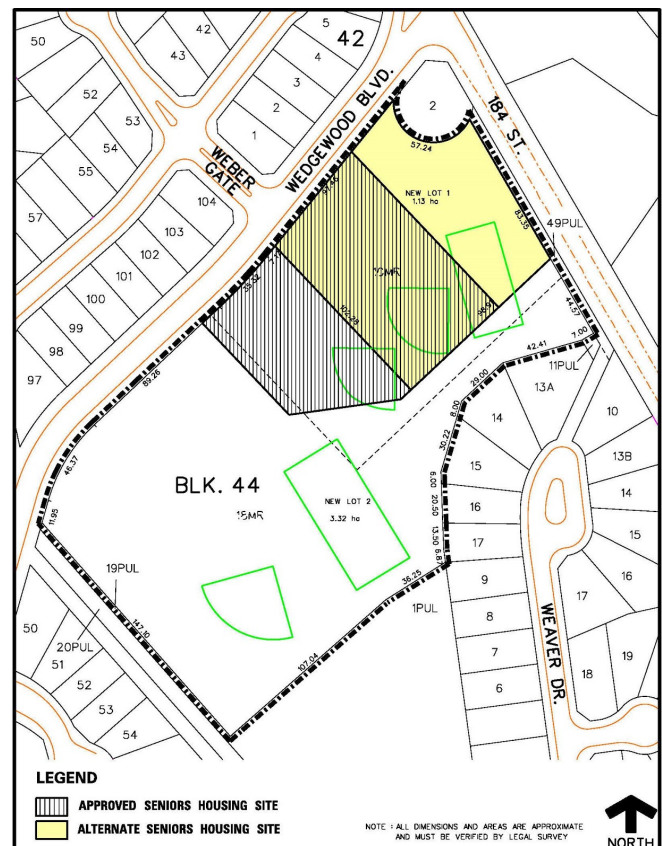
Open House Details
