AUTHORIZED IDENTIFICATION

The identification requirements have changed for the 2013 General Election. In accordance with Sec. 53(1) of the *Local Authorities Election Act* (Proof of Elector Eligibility) and Sec. 95(1)(a)(ii) of the *Election Act*, in order to vote, an elector must produce one piece of identification that establishes both the elector's name and current residential address.

An elector may vote after producing **Government Issued Identification** containing the elector's photograph, current residential address and name. This includes an Operator's (Driver's) Licence or an Alberta Identification Card.

Other forms of **Authorized Identification** with both the elector's name and current residential address are:

- Attestation of Residence issued by the landlord of a Commercial Property Management Company
- Attestation of Residence issued by the responsible authority of a First Nations band or reserve
- Attestation of Residence issued by the responsible authority of a Supportive Living Facility or Treatment Center
- Bank/credit card statement or personal cheque
- Correspondence issued by a school, college or university
- Government cheque or cheque stub
- Income/property tax assessment notice
- Insurance policy or coverage card
- Letter from a public curator, public quardian or public trustee
- One of the following, issued by the responsible authority of a shelter or soup kitchen:
 - > Attestation of residence
 - Letter of stay
 - > Admission form, or
 - > Statement of benefits
- Pension Plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation
- Residential lease or mortgage statement



- Statement of government benefits, for example:
 - > Employment insurance
 - Old-age securitySocial assistance,

 - > Disability support, or
 - > Child tax benefit
- Utility bill, for example:
 - > Telephone
 - > Public Utilities Commission
 - > Television, or
 - > Hydro, gas or water
- Vehicle ownership, registration or insurance certificate
