Neighbourhood Matching Fund Guidelines

Large/Medium/Small Projects Fund

The Neighbourhood Revitalization Matching Fund supports the communities involved in City of Edmonton Neighbourhood Revitalization initiatives in carrying out the actions and goals identified in the community based strategies. Funds are available on a matching basis to address a specific community need and that also builds and benefits the community. **Projects must be completed within a 12 month timeframe. Please use attached application and budget forms format.**

- Large Projects Fund is for projects that request from \$ 10,000 - \$ 20,000.
- Medium Projects Fund: \$5000 – \$10,000.
- Small Projects Fund: up to \$5000.
- Applicants are welcome to do a presentation and answer questions for large grants

Matching your Grant

You must match 50% of your total project cost with one or a combination donations, labour/sweat equity or cash, grants (other than municipal).

Large Grants must have 25% cash matching. Cash could include grants or revenue.

Application Deadline: 15th of the month January - November

Who Can Apply

Organizations, Business, Associations, AD HOC Community Group whose purpose is solely for the purpose of carrying out the specific project large grants must have support from an established organization.

Projects must be based in and/or benefit the communities of: Eastwood, Parkdale Cromdale, Alberta Avenue, Westwood, Spruce Avenue, West Jasper Place, Glenwood, Canora, Britannia/Youngstown, McCauley Central McDougall or Queen Mary Park.

Types of Projects

Projects could include but are not limited to:

- Advancing arts in the community

- Inspire community connections
- Celebrate multicultural connections/awareness
- Special events that promote the area and offer an opportunity for the community to come together and celebrate
- Focus on the history of the area
- Promote and encourage beautification and cleanliness
- Build community capacity i.e.: co-op kitchens, community gardens
- Recreation programming
- Does not duplicate other programs
- Parkland Improvement maximum of \$10, 000.00

Project Reporting

All grants recipients must submit a report briefly describing the project and verification of expenditures.

Financial Report and copies of receipts must be submitted with in 90 days of project completion.

Grant Appeals

Grant appeals can be submitted to Stephane Labonne, Director, City of Edmonton, Office of Great Neighbourhoods. Appeals must be received within one month of notification or rejection of award. A letter outlining indicating your rationale for appeal must accompany your appeal. Appeals can be emailed to stephanelabonne@edmonton.ca. A meeting will held with the applicant and a decision made by the Director of the Office of Great Neighbourhoods. A final decision will be made with 30 days.

How will applications be evaluated?

Grants will be reviewed and awarded by the Office of Great Neighbourhoods.
