

UTILITIES INFRASTRUCTURE West Jasper Place/Sherwood Bi-Weekly Project Update – April 1, 2016

The City of Edmonton is committed to providing the residents of West Jasper Place and Sherwood with regular information updates about the City's sewer rehabilitation project in your neighbourhoods. Open House

- Immediately after the shaft at 99 Avenue is opened in May, members of our project team will go out to meet with the residents directly adjacent to the work site to gather their feedback regarding noise and odours. Shortly thereafter, we plan to hold an open house to hear back from the rest of the community about what they are experiencing.

Alberta Health Services (AHS)

- We are continuing to work in partnership with AHS and share monitoring data and procedures when the shaft is opened in May. To date, no concerns have been identified.

Chemical Injections at pump stations

- Nitrate injections have started at a local wastewater pump station to the north. Testing of different dosages of peroxide will start on April 11 at the Laurier Heights pump station.

Task Force meeting

The following items were raised at the March 10, 2016 Task Force meeting:

Truck Traffic

- In response to concerns over dump truck traffic leaving the site at 151 Street and 99 Avenue heading west, we will be rerouting the truck traffic so that it heads east to 149 Street.

Temporary Sidewalk (south side of 99 Avenue, east of 150 Street)

- We are currently exploring the possibilities of providing a temporary sidewalk to allow pedestrians to walk from 151 Street to 150 Street along 99 Avenue. We will provide an update once we have more information.

Construction Update

Phase 1

- After review of safety concerns at the intersection of 151 Street and 99 Avenue, Transportation Operations has advised that east-west traffic through this intersection should no longer be permitted. Residents north of 99 Avenue can continue to use the access provided from the west side of the intersection. Residents to the east of 151 Street along 99 Avenue will continue to have access to their homes from the east.
- Work on the installation of the bypass system components within the shaft at 151 Street and 100 Avenue is ongoing.
- Construction of the 450-mm (18-inch) diameter sewer connection to the shaft at 100 Avenue will then start and is expected to take just under two weeks.

Phase 2

- There are no planned activities which may cause changes to the impacts of traffic and pedestrian access over the next month.
- Excavation of the west hand tunnel is continuing, and tunneling of the east has been started as well.
