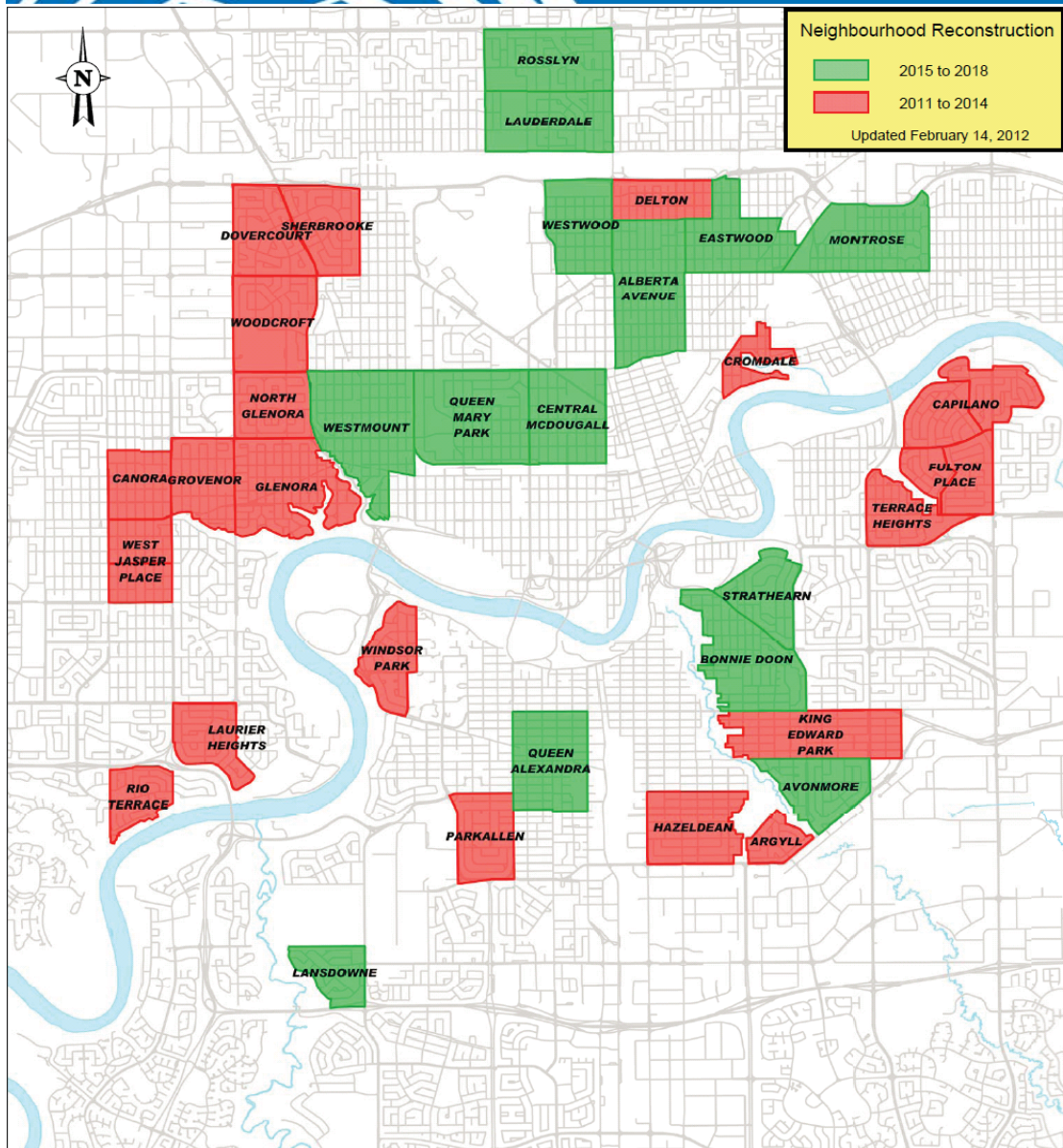
In Your Neighbourhood:

The City of Edmonton is:

- Renewing and replacing sewers.
- Co-ordinating utility repairs (EPCOR and ATCO).
- Reconstructing roads, curbs and sidewalks on City-owned property.
- Replacing streetlights.
- Working with residents to improve pedestrian and cycling accessibility.
- Adding to your neighbourhood's livability.

A Unique Program:

- BGN is a long-term, planned, integrated approach to improve and replace essential infrastructure in Edmonton's mature neighbourhoods.
- This advances several long-term City goals:
 - Improve Edmonton's livability.
 - Promote active transportation (walking and cycling).
 - Preserve and sustain the environment.



Reconstruction of North Glenora will begin in 2013.

Neighbourhoods being reconstructed:

2011-14: 20 neighbourhoods

2015-18: 14 neighbourhoods

Total: 34 neighbourhoods

Meeting 1 - Community League

Discussion:

- Any community led projects or initiatives that could be opportunities for neighbourhood capital investments.
- Suggestions of capital investments for the neighbourhood that improve livability.
- Drainage has initiated the inspection and renewal of the sewer system.



Meeting 2 (TODAY) - Design Open House

Designs informed by:

- Conversation with the community league.
- Our walk through the neighbourhood.
- City design standards and policies.



Feedback: We ask that you look at these designs and use your knowledge of your neighbourhood to advise us if there are missing design elements such as:

- sidewalk links
- bicycle facilities
- traffic signs

This will help us with our final design.



Meeting 3 - Construction Plans and Local Improvement Information
