## Valley Line LRT - Stage 1 (Downtown to Mill Woods) Citizen Working Groups - Highlights & Composition


## **PURPOSE**

- Facilitate information-sharing and dialogue
- Support the identification of issues, opportunities and concerns
- Seek opportunities to minimize and mitigate impacts related to detailed design and construction

## **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Neighbourhood based
- Cross-section of community in 5 zones
- Local representation
  - o 1-2 assigned by each community league
  - o 2 from the community at large
  - o 1-2 assigned by local business organizations
  - o 1 from each community group having major presence
  - o 1-2 representing local schools, in consultation with school boards
  - o 1-2 from seniors community, in consultation with Seniors Coordinating Council (where populations warrant)
  - o 1 from the administration of a major institution

## **GUIDELINES**

Membership

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- Volunteers to be representative cross-section
- Group to function until Valley Line begins service
- Membership/composition reviewed annually

#### Conduct of Meetings

- Facilitated by Community Relations Advisor
- Regular & timely sharing of information
- Identify issues, opportunities & concerns
- No decision-making (mandate cannot be delegated)
  - Alignment, concept, preliminary design & P3 procurement not up for debate O City will not revisit key past decisions
- Members to understand/share local knowledge & interests
- Mutual respect & trust
- Support overall best interests of community
- Treat participation as a commitment
- Except for City staff & Councillors who may be present, non-members attend only by mutual agreement of group

#### Scheduling, Agendas, Facilities etc.

- Meeting frequency, times, duration flexible; determined by group
- Topics identified in advance
- Minutes within 2 weeks after meetings
- Agendas & minutes posted on website
- City to arrange / provide / pay for facilities


#### Current & Upcoming Activities







