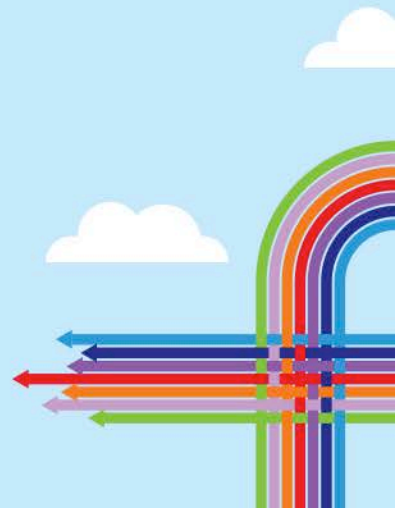

Vision & direction for transit system over the next 25 years.

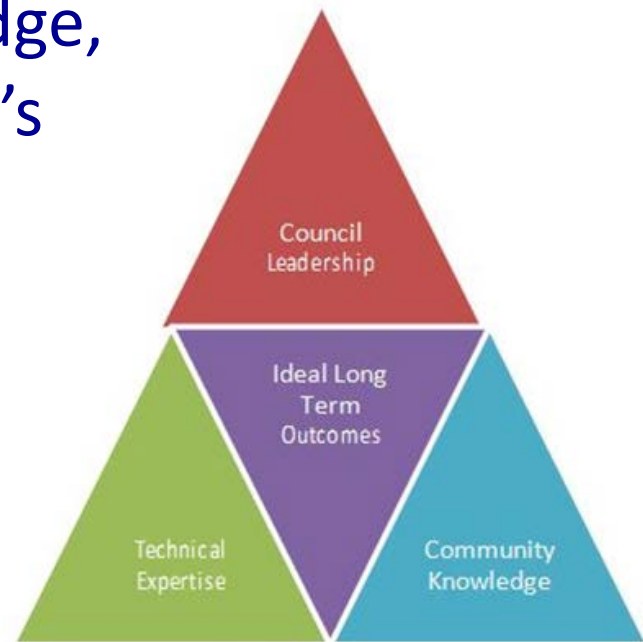
What do we need to do to get there?

What is the Transit Strategy?

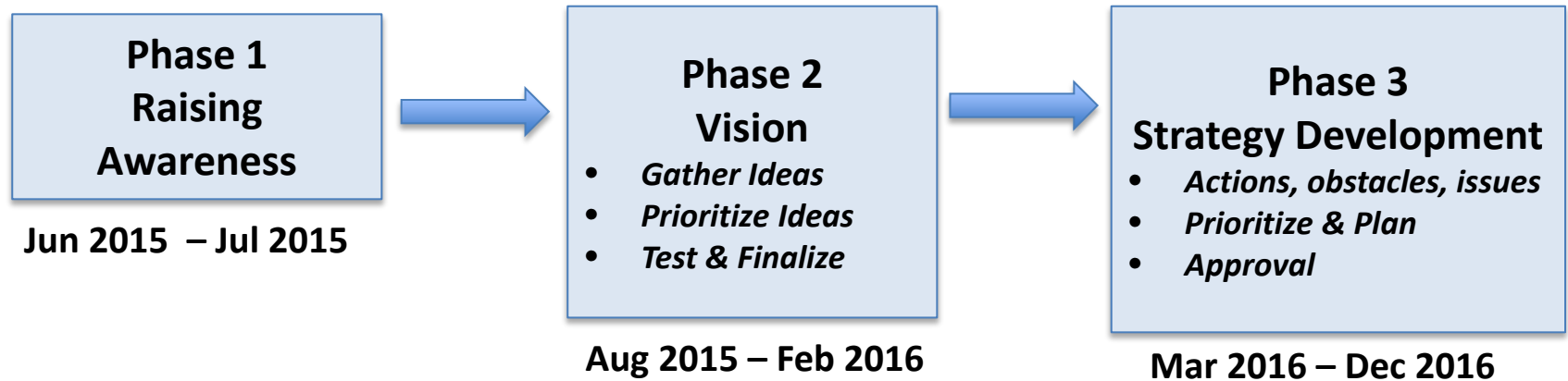
Balance of community knowledge, technical expertise and Council's leadership in decision-making.

LRT for the future

We're also working to figure out the order of construction of the future LRT network.

This project is tied closely to Transit Strategy.

We want to know what matters to Edmontonians about transit in general, and specifically about the future construction of LRT.

- We'll then work with the public to write a vision and guiding principles.



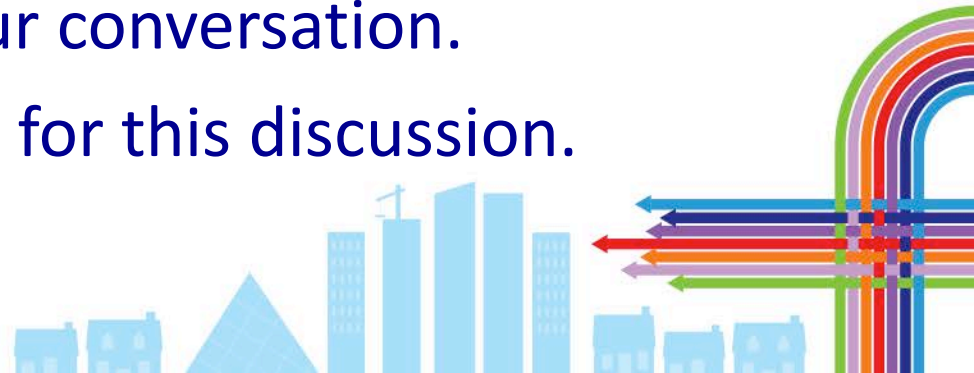
What we've heard

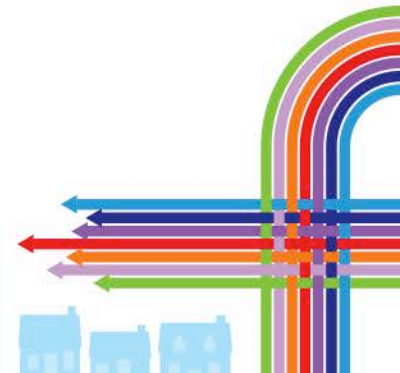
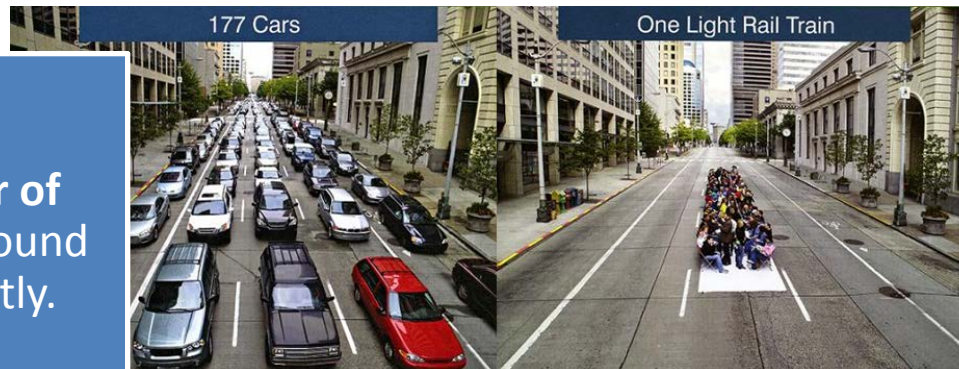

Future transit network

AVAILABLE -

Transit service is available nights and weekends, as well as for special events (e.g., festivals, sports games).

CLOSE -

Bus stops, transit centres and LRT stations are located within close walking distance to/from most homes and major destinations

EXTENSIVE -

Transit goes to all areas within the city, and possibly outside of Edmonton, but it may not be a close walk to every home and major destination.

FAST -

Once you're on board the bus or LRT, it gets you to your destination as quickly or more quickly than driving a personal vehicle.

FREQUENT -

Transit service comes often.

INTEGRATED -

Transit service has limited negative impact on the general vehicle traffic flow.

RELIABLE -

The bus / LRT comes on time and arrives at destinations according to the advertised transit schedule.

OTHER -

Related to the transit system network (please explain)

Future customer experience

COSTS LESS - than a personal vehicle, e.g.

- Owning, Operating, Parking

CLEAN & COMFORTABLE - vehicles, stations and shelters, e.g.,

- Clean inside and outside; Heat and air conditioning ; Well maintained

EASY TO UNDERSTAND, e.g.

- Understanding how to use transit; Planning your trip; Finding your way on transit

EASY TO USE, e.g.

- Flexible payment options' Making transfers; Park and ride at transit stations ; Flexible scheduling or on-demand service

FRIENDLY & HELPFUL, e.g.

- Transit staff; Timely and useful communications; Welcoming environment for all people

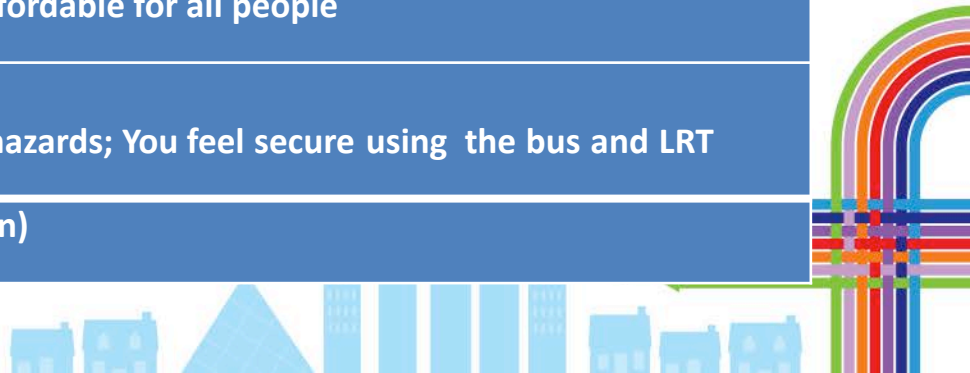
INCLUSIVE, e.g.


- Accessible to people with mobility challenges; Affordable for all people

SAFE & SECURE, e.g.

- Vehicles, stations and shelters are free of safety hazards; You feel secure using the bus and LRT

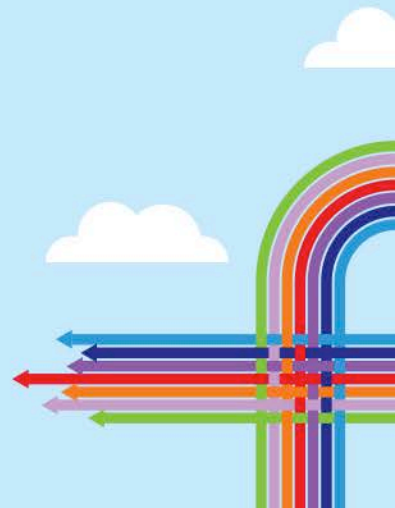

What are we doing?

- The City is developing a plan for construction of Edmonton's future LRT network
- We are evaluating the LRT Network to determine the order of construction and funding options
