DEAR COMMONWEALTH STADIUM AREA RESIDENTS:

In 2017, parking restrictions during major COMMONWEALTH STADIUM events will be in effect during the time indicated on the schedule. During a major stadium event, only vehicles displaying a valid permit may park. Please refer to the map for areas affected by the parking restrictions.

- **Parking in restricted areas is a violation for residents if a valid permit is not displayed upon the front windshield of the vehicle.**
- **Vehicles in violation may be fined \$75.00 and towed from site.**
- **It is an offence under Traffic Bylaw #5590, Section #74 (\$250.00 fine) to drive across a sidewalk or boulevard where there is no curb crossing in order to park vehicles.**

To obtain a permit you **must be a resident** of the restricted area shown on the map, and be able to produce a valid vehicle registration documenting your residency in the restricted area. Single dwelling homes and including multi-family buildings (three stories or less) qualify for parking permits. Residents must apply for a Temporary Parking Permit one week prior to the event.

Vehicles without a valid permit will not be permitted to park for the time as indicated on the schedule.

CRITERIA FOR RESTRICTED RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMITS

At least one of the following criteria must be met, in addition to the presentation of a valid driver's license to the subject address, before an Annual Restricted Residential Parking Permit will be issued.

RESIDENT WITHIN RESTRICTED RESIDENTIAL PARKING AREA

- A. Vehicle registered to subject address and in the name of the resident. or
- B. Vehicle registered in someone else's name and registered to a different address,
1. a letter of authorization from the registered owner indicating that the applicant has approval to use the vehicle; and
 2. any other verifiable documentation such as a utility bill, lease agreement, etc. for the subject address, in the name of the resident, or
- C. Vehicle registered to an out-of-City or out-of-Province address but in the name of the resident. In addition to the registration certificate, any other verifiable document such as a utility bill, lease agreement, etc. for subject address, in the name of the resident, must be presented.

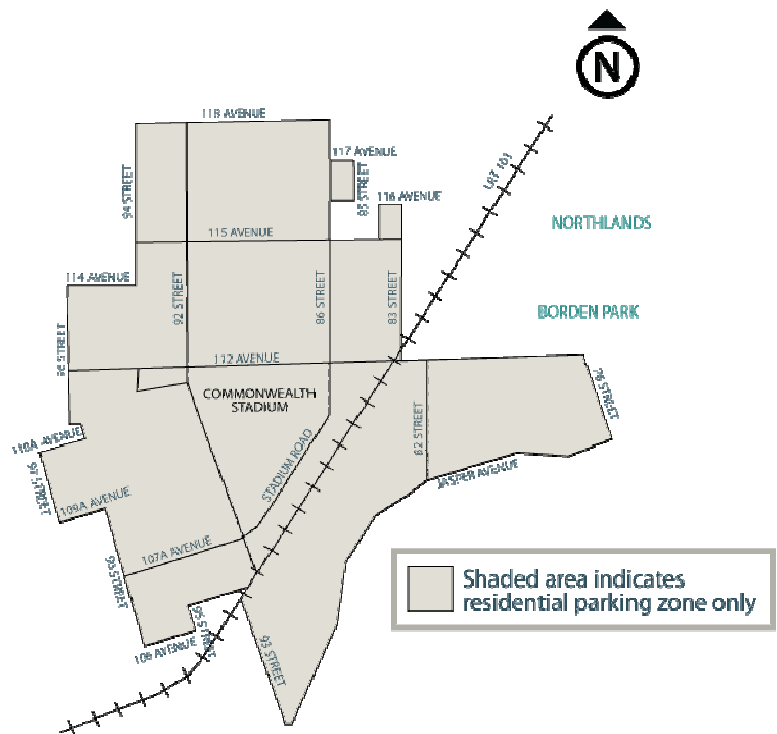
Area business employees will only be issued permits for vehicles registered within the restricted parking area. Employees of businesses within the designated area will NOT be eligible for parking permits for their private vehicles.

Under NO circumstances will a Restricted Residential Parking Permit be issued to an address without a vehicle being identified.

Parking in restricted areas is a violation for residents if a Valid Parking Permit is not attached to the vehicle.

PARKING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY

Property owners selling or providing parking spaces for stadium patrons on privately owned property, like a back yard, front yard, or driveway, is strictly prohibited in residential zones. A development permit and a business license are required for this type of activity, but cannot be obtained in residential areas. Municipal Enforcement Officers will be in the community during stadium events to specifically deal with illegal parking lots and businesses operating without a business license. The minimum fine for operating without a business license is \$450, and the minimum fine for operating without a development permit is \$1000. For more information, please contact 311.



The City of Edmonton Traffic Bylaw #5590, Section 37 and Section 37.1, regarding Permit Required states:

A vehicle shall not be parked on a highway in any location where a permit to park is required unless a valid and subsisting permit is clearly displayed on the vehicle.

A vehicle shall not be parked on a highway in any location where a permit to park is required during major stadium events unless a valid and subsisting permit is clearly displayed on the vehicle.
