OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELLNESS COMMITMENT

The health, safety and wellness of employees and others performing a service on behalf of the City of Edmonton is of primary importance in all aspects of our operations.

The ten elements of the health and safety program:

- Organizational Commitment
 Outlines the roles and responsibilities
 of the managers, directors, supervisors
 and employees in creating a safe and
 healthy workplace.
- Hazard Recognition and Assessment
 Hazards found in the workplace are identified and assessed so everyone is aware of them.
- Once identified and assessed, hazards must be eliminated or controlled through engineering, administrative or personal protective equipment strategies.
- Joint Health and Safety Committees and Safety Representatives
 Health and safety committees bring supervisors and workers together to collaboratively participate in health and safety activities in the workplace.
- Orientation and Training

 New employees must be oriented to the hazards of the workplace and everyone trained in working safely.

6 Other Worksite Parties at or in Vicinity of the Worksite

Managing health and safety hazards to City Contractors and other parties who may be affected by workplace activities.

- 7 Safety Inspections
 Physical inspections of the workplace monitor hazard controls and identify any potential new hazards.
- 8 Emergency Response Planning
 In the event of a workplace emergency, we
 must be prepared to respond effectively. Planning
 ahead helps us stay calm in an emergency. Life
 safety is always our primary concern.
- 9 Incident Investigation

 If an incident occurs, it must be reported and thoroughly investigated to determine underlying causes so we can prevent recurrence of similar incidents.
 - Program Administration

 Document all of the health and safety processes and monitor the effectiveness of our program to create a safe and healthy workplace.
