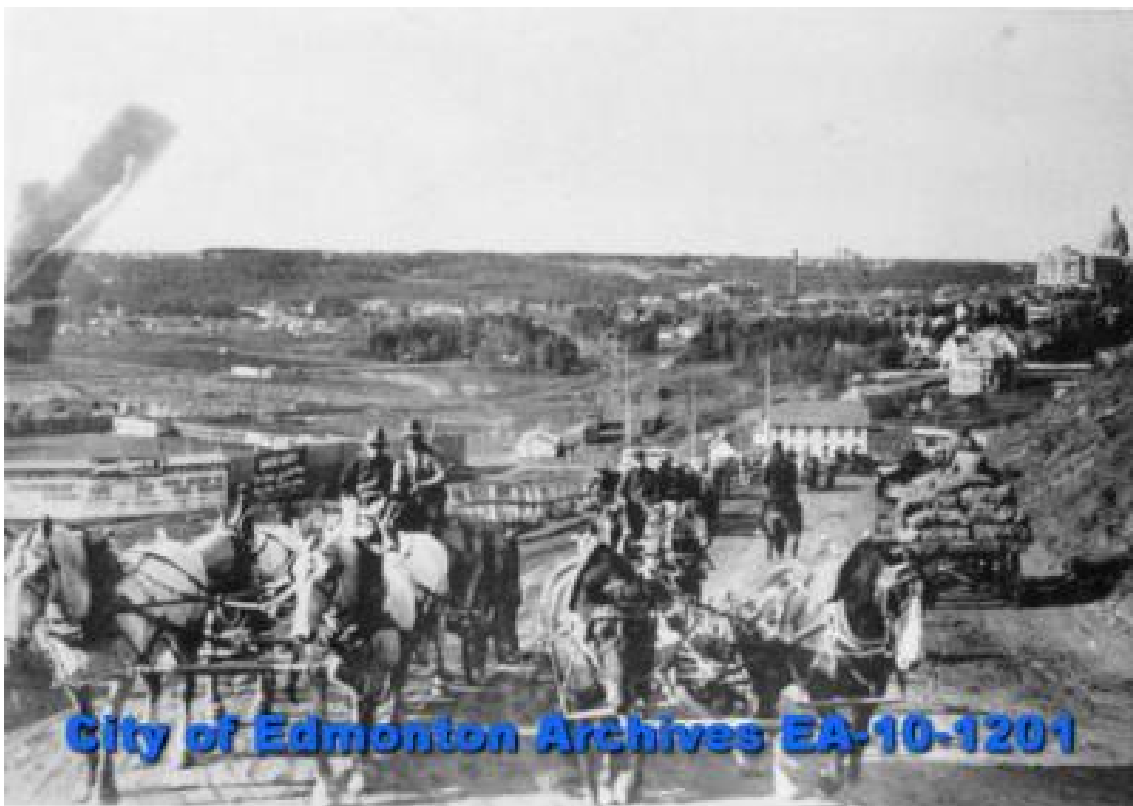


Canada 150 Edmonton Trivia Set 14: Industry
