

Update: Recreation

BACKGROUND:

- Active recreation, sport, and leisure opportunities significantly contribute to the quality of life in Edmonton. Edmontonians value active, healthy lifestyles and want their municipal government to work with them to create invigorating recreational opportunities accessible to the widest range of abilities, ages, cultures and incomes. Recreation facilities serve as community hubs, bringing people together in welcoming and vibrant settings.
- The City of Edmonton provides significant support to recreation and sport communities in Edmonton. The City is working with partners on several projects to provide enhanced public recreation opportunities.
- The Recreation Facility Master Plan and supporting plans and strategies provide more detailed direction for facility and program development. Based on these plans there are numerous facilities under development and redevelopment (see Appendix).

DESIRED OUTCOMES:

- Ensure alignment of recreation and sport efforts and initiatives with strategic policy directions.
- Increase the quality and quantity of sports and recreation opportunities in Edmonton.

ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC DIRECTION:

- This Council initiative is primarily related to the goal of “Improving Edmonton’s Livability” from *The Way Ahead*. The policy will:
 - Enhance social connectedness for all citizens;
 - Reduce barriers to participation in recreation activities and local programs; and
 - Improve, continuously, the capacity and capability of the organization in the delivery of services to the community and citizens.
- This Council initiative is related to several objectives from *The Way We Live*:
 - “The City of Edmonton celebrates and promotes healthy living”;
 - “The City of Edmonton has a vibrant, diverse sports sector for all Edmontonians”.

This recreation initiative would also touch on policies related to parks and natural spaces, and access to opportunities and programs.

START-UP BUDGET REQUIREMENTS:

- No new budget allocation is required. Projects are brought forward to City Council through the Capital Budget process.
