



Proposed Ward Boundary Adjustments: Leduc County/Town of Beaumont Annexation

Edmonton's City Council is made up of thirteen elected officials; a Mayor and twelve Councillors. Edmontonians elect a Mayor, and a Councillor for the ward in which they reside. A general municipal election is held every four years, although by-elections may occur periodically. The next general municipal election is scheduled for October 18, 2021.

Maps of proposed ward boundaries can be found below.

When adjusting ward boundaries, a number of criteria are considered. These include:

- The current population of the ward
- How the population of a ward may grow
- The boundaries that may already exist in an area, such as community league boundaries
- Using existing features that make boundaries easy to identify, such as roadways or rivers
- Creating wards that are relatively block shaped, with straight sides

Following a review by residents and other stakeholders in the annexed areas, including school boards and community groups, the revised boundaries will be reviewed by Edmonton City Council. Ward changes will then be approved by bylaw.

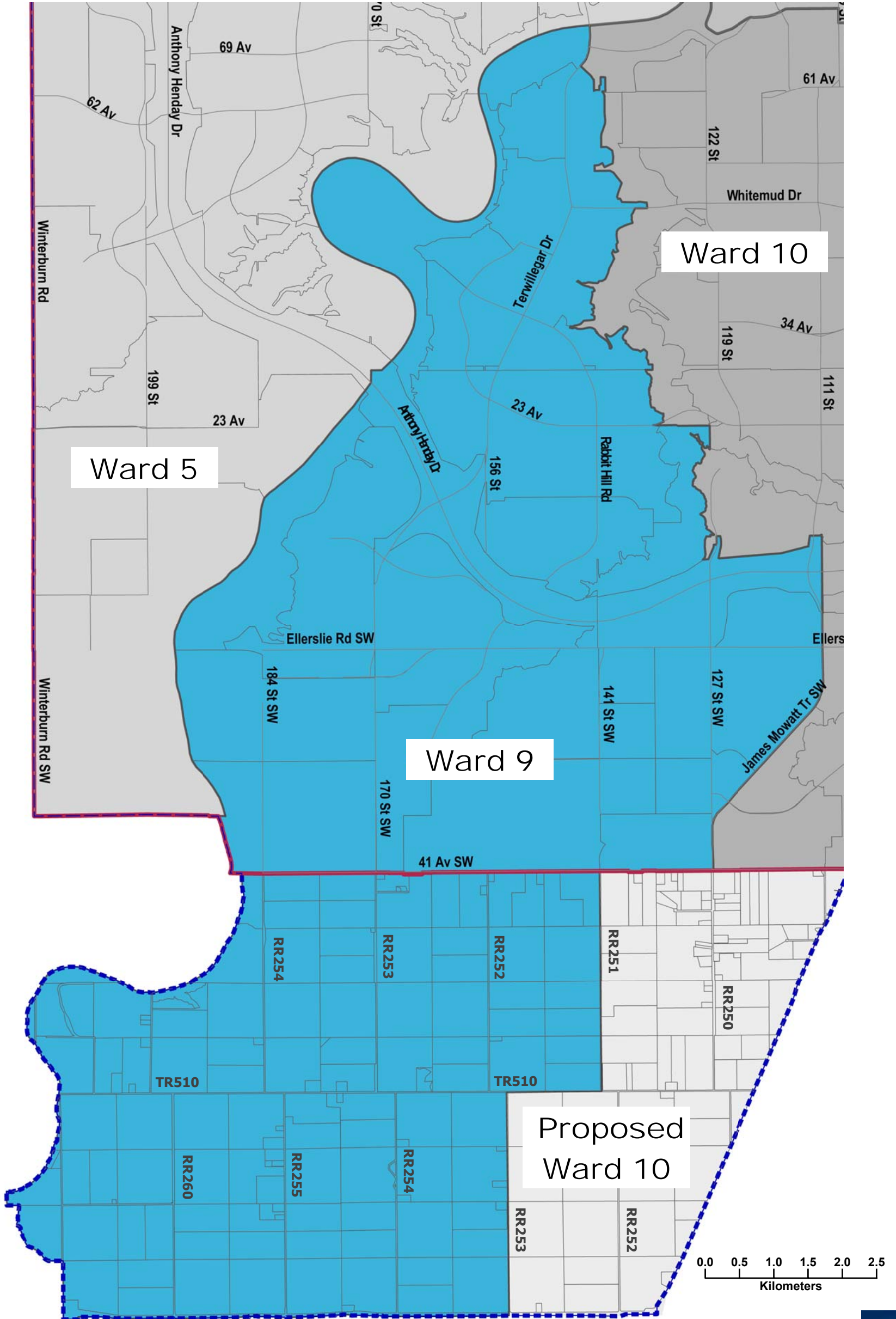

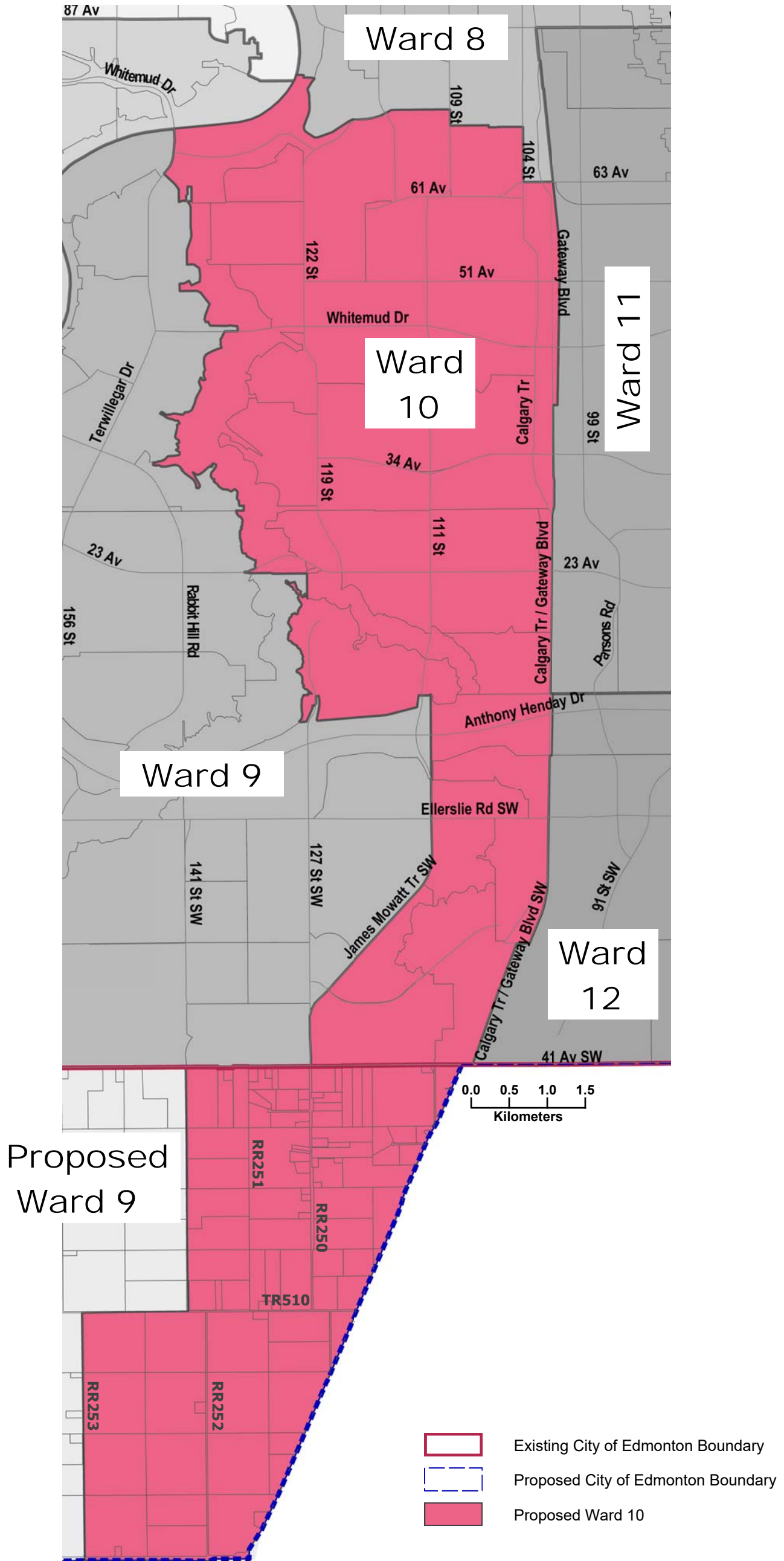
Proposed Ward Boundary Change - Ward 9
