


Project Background

Project Overview

The purpose of this project is to ensure a long-term strategic approach for the development, use and management of Gallagher Park; including its site partner's attractions and programming, through the development of a 20year Concept Plan.

A concept plan builds on existing plans, policies and initiatives while identifying public needs and priorities for the park. The plan also provides direction for environmental protection and recommends civic, cultural and recreational uses that are appropriate to the area.





Site History, Inventory & Analysis

Gallagher Park has always been a cherished and well-used river valley park. This location has been traditionally used as a gathering spot and place of commerce by Indigenous people and new settlers. It now provides walking, cycling and commuter access to river valley trails, the downtown core and the adjacent neighbourhoods both in the river valley and topping its banks. As a River Valley Park, its environmental assets are protected and, with careful planning, enhanced for the enjoyment of both Edmontonians and visitors. Spectacular views from the park are some of the best our City has to offer.


The Environmental Overview for this project has investigated local environmental conditions including:

- Surface and groundwater, soils and terrain stability
- Past contamination
- Vegetation communities, weeds, and rare plants
- Wildlife species, connectivity, and species at risk
- Historical resources



The project area is important in Edmonton's history. A few significant points in Gallagher Park's history:

- Indigenous settlements were common along the North Saskatchewan River.
- Gallagher Park was created and named in 1958 after Cornelius Gallagher.
- The Edmonton Ski Club was established in 1911.
- Cloverdale Community League was established in 1920.
- The Muttart Conservatory was built in Gallagher Park in 1976.
- The Edmonton Folk Music festival was first held in Gallagher Park in 1981.

Vision Statement & Guiding Principles


Our vision for Gallagher Park, the only river valley park accessed by LRT, is a hub for distinctive year–round recreational experiences that is integrated into the thriving city core and river valley system.

The **guiding principles** are:

- Facilitate enhanced access to both active and passive recreational activities
- + Enhance the ecological values of the park
- Provide facilities and infrastructure that support and enhance existing recreation and complimentary uses
- Encourage LRT and active transportation access to the Park and its activities


Participants and respondents for the Phase 1 Engagement were generally very supportive of the proposed vision and guiding principles, and in agreement with the various components. There was considerable support for access by LRT, encouraging active transportation modes, access for persons with disabilities, and support for enhancing the ecological values of the park.

This vision statement and guiding principles were communicated and endorsed as part of Phase 1 of the project.









What We Heard and Observed

Phase 1 Engagement: Gathering Ideas and Development of a Vision Statement & Guiding Principles

In support of citizen engagement in the first phase of development of this Concept Plan, the City of Edmonton hosted an engagement event on March 6, 2019, at the Cloverdale Community Hall.

The focus of this event was to secure input from the public on the proposed draft vision and guiding principles for the project and to gather additional ideas that would assist in the development of draft concept plan alternatives.

Stakeholder and Public Input

Input was obtained from site parters including the Cloverdale Community League, the Edmonton Folk Music Festival, the Edmonton Ski Club and the Muttart Conservatory, other external stakeholders, such as the Bennett Centre and from the public and stakeholders as summarized in the What We Heard report from Phase 1 of the project.

In addition to the proposed guiding principles, participants in the Phase 1 engagement also identified the following as important considerations in the development of the concept plan alternatives for Gallagher Park:

- Access and accessibility
- + Environment and heritage
- Recreational activities
- Amenities
- Safety and security







...and how participants currently access Gallagher Park.












Below are examples of additions to Gallagher Park that could be made possible through funding from a partner organization or community group. Which of these proposed enhancements are most important to you?



















Optional Enhancements — Landscaping





In this option, a sidewalk would be provided along the east side of 95 Street.






In this option, a minimum




Optional Enhancements — Vehicle Access

As shown below, there are two alternatives for providing vehicle access to the parking area in the park. Please identify your preference for either Option 1 or Option 2.









Vehicle Access – From 96A Street

Vehicle Access – From West

In this option, the existing vehicle entry at the south end of 96A Street would be retained and enhanced. This access would not be affected by LRT operations or vehicles servicing the Muttart Conservatory.

In this option, a new vehicle access would be provided across the LRT track and south of the Muttart Conservatory. The existing vehicle access form the south end of 96A Street would be used for emergency access only. This option could reduce vehicular traffic on local streets in Cloverdale.
