This study will seek to transform a large portion of Norwood Boulevard (111 Avenue and 112 Avenue) from 109 Street to 82 Street.



The project goal is to recreate Norwood Boulevard into an innovative, vibrant and relevant streetscape that will strive to balance the needs of the community, commuters, businesses and visitors, and meet the Main Street Guidelines.

The study will focus on:

- establishing a unified vision for the future of Norwood Boulevard
- updating current land use policies
- improving transportation (particularly for pedestrians and cyclists)
- promoting new design policies and other changes to help create a street of exceptional quality for all people to work, live, learn and play.

What transportation improvements could be made in and around this study area to make it safer and/or more convenient?

What would it take to make this corridor a more attractive and safer place to walk?









Design Ideas:

Urban design addresses streets and public spaces, whole neighborhoods and districts, and entire cities, with the goal of making urban areas functional (accessible to all people), attractive, and sustainable.

What kinds of public spaces and/or gathering places could enhance the livability and attractiveness of the study area?
