### INTRODUCTION

You are invited to submit a response to the following Partner Interest Exploration (PIE) relating to potential partnership opportunities for transforming the Coliseum building in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada.

The intent of this process is to conduct an exploration of interest from potential partners to transform the existing Coliseum building into a multiplex sport and recreation facility. The City of Edmonton is using this PIE to understand which organizations have interest and capacity to potentially contribute to the transformation in the following ways:

- Investing capital;
- Becoming an operating partner;
- Providing programming and/or services in a re-purposed retrofit of the existing Coliseum building.

Submissions will be reviewed by the City's Coliseum Transformation Project Team to gauge the level of interest in this project and how each submission complements a multiplex sport and/or recreation facility development in the existing Coliseum building.

The information supplied in this PIE is high level and general in nature. No contract awards will be made based on the responses provided, however all response ideas will be compounded and shared to City Council and some of the ideas generated some of the responses may be used, in part, in the development of a business case to assess the idea's feasibility. Development of the business case will be led by the City of Edmonton and will be presented to City Council in April 2017. The City may seek clarification on submissions or request additional information to assist in the business case development.

Within the same timeframe as the PIE, the City will also be conducting public engagement, including two open houses for citizens and special interest groups to share ideas.

**PLEASE NOTE:** The City or the project team is not obligated to further explore all submission ideas received from organizations as a result of this PIE. The purpose of the process is to engage with and generate ideas from the community. The ideas generated from this and other public engagement efforts will be shared to City Council. Submitting a response is not binding to any party.

Facility Details:	The Coliseum Building Located at 7424 118 Avenue, Edmonton, AB, T5B 0Y2. The facility currently covers a site footprint of 167,000 square feet, with total square footage for all six levels totalling 461,536 square feet. It has 16,877 fixed seats with a capacity of 18,500. (Please note: ideas for redevelopment of surrounding land and the rest of the Northlands site are not included in this exploration.)

### THE FACILITY

Name: The Coliseum Building

**Location:** Bordering the neighbourhoods of <u>Montrose</u>, <u>Bellevue</u>, <u>Eastwood</u> and <u>Parkdale</u>

**Occupancy:** To be determined - anticipated in 2018

### **CURRENT STATE**

The City of Edmonton currently leases the Coliseum to Northlands, a not-for-profit organization comprised of a Part IX Company and an agricultural society formed under Alberta's *Agricultural Societies Act*. All lands and structures on the site are in a long-term lease, which expires in 2034 with a renewal option available to 2049.

As of September 2016, the NHL Edmonton Oilers hockey team vacated the Coliseum (previously named Rexall Place) and relocated to the new Rogers Place arena in downtown Edmonton. The WHL Edmonton Oil Kings and LiveNation produced concerts have also moved to Rogers Place arena, creating a vacancy and an immediate drop in operating revenue for Northlands.

These factors prompted Northlands to look at redevelopment of the site. In December 2015, Northlands submitted a proposal to the City of Edmonton entitled "Vision 2020: The Re-creation of Recreation". In March 2016, Northlands made a presentation to City Council on its Vision 2020 proposal. In response, City Council passed an 11-part motion asking Administration to examine the Northlands proposal in detail with the commitment to hold a public hearing by August 31, 2016.

Vision 2020 proposed repurposing the Coliseum into a facility with: six (6) arenas; fitness club; climbing wall; running/walking track; party rooms; and a wide range of commercial retail units that support sport and tournaments.

On September 6, 2016 City Council passed the following motion:

That Administration seek partners for repurposing the Coliseum into a multiplex arena, pending securing necessary consent from Edmonton Northlands (Northlands) and the Edmonton Arena Corporation Administration, should consult with the public and user groups, and explore partnerships with interested hockey organizations and other amateur sports organizations, as well as potential hotel and development partners, and report back to Council in the first quarter of 2017, and bring a budget profile to advance conceptual design.

To further explore this council motion, City Administration created a Coliseum Transformation project team to, in part, engage the public on their ideas for the Coliseum repurposing.

# **Part 2: General Process and Information**

### THE REVIEW TEAM

The Coliseum Transformation project team will be reviewing all submissions to help assess the viability of each potential partnership scenario. The project team will use the review process to gauge partner interest in this project and how each submission complements a multiplex arena development in the Coliseum building. Some of the responses to this Partner Interest Exploration (PIE) will aid in the development of a business case for Council's consideration in April 2017.

### FOR RESPONDENTS' INFORMATION

We welcome and invite proposals from organizations that support amateur sport and recreation and are interested in the transformation and operation of the Coliseum. The transformation of this facility is an exciting and innovative opportunity for organizations to partner with the City to create a hub for sport and recreation in the existing building.

In assessing potential space use and best fit under each proposal, the team will assess interest from responses based on some or all of the following criteria:

- Organizational background and capacity
- Alignment with organizational mandate and City strategies
- Project need/community benefit and impact
- Ability to collaborate and create positive synergies with other partners
- Proposed type and level of sport (specific league/age level)
- Proposed single user and/or multiple users (i.e., professional and/or highest level and/or community use)
- Amount of retrofitting needed for the proposed plan
- Proposed food and/or merchandise sales
- Parking requirements
- Sponsorship and potential name sales plan
- Revenue streams
- Proposed secondary uses of the facility
- Potential joint use of the facility (multi-partner model)

All sport and recreation organizations

### **QUALIFICATIONS**

The responding organization must be a not-for-profit organization, public service provider, or private sector organization registered for more than one year. The responding organization must not be in arrears to the City unless a repayment plan has been approved and is being followed.
