Proposed Improvements

Design Features and Benefits

- + Maintains right turn eastbound to southbound
- + Modifications of the southbound to westbound right turn radius resulting in speed reduction
- + Signalization of the southbound to westbound right turn lane
- + Modification of the southwest corner to increase visibility for pedestrian, cyclists and for southbound travelling lanes
- + Single-stage pedestrian crossing with more visible pedestrian waiting locations
- + Right-turn on red will not be permitted for eastbound traffic

What We Heard

Major Themes:

Pedestrian Safety:

Pedestrian safety was mentioned by multiple participants at the Public Engagement Session on March 4 and the online survey.

Southbound Access from Saskatchewan Drive:

There was resounding support to maintain the right turn eastbound Saskatchewan Drive to southbound 99 Street. Keeping this turn would ensure vehicles do not cut through the neighbourhood to access 99 Street southbound. Residents from the nearby condos and Skunk Hollow would be able to access amenities in the area, such as the University of Alberta Hospital, Whyte Avenue, and Calgary Trail, without detouring through downtown and the river valley.

Construction Staging

The following items are now fixed and not subject to change:

- + Signal relocations at northwest and southwest corners
- + Reconstruction of northwest corner includes pavement removal and sidewalk reconstruction
- + Reconstruction of southwest corner includes sidewalk reconstruction
- + Asphalt overlay of entire intersection will be done overnight
- + All vehicle movements will be maintained during peak hours
- + Shared use path movements will be maintained at all times, pedestrian detours may occur throughout construction
