BYLAW 19061
PROHIBITED BUSINESSES BYLAW**

Edmonton City Council enacts:

PART I - GENERAL

| PURPOSE | 1 | The purpose of this bylaw is to prohibit certain businesses and business activities. |
| DEFINITIONS | 2 | <p>(1) Unless otherwise specified, words used in this bylaw have the same meaning as defined in the <i>Municipal Government Act</i>, RSA 2000, c M-26.</p> <p>(2) In this bylaw:</p> <p>(a) “business” means</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">(i) a commercial, merchandising, or industrial activity or undertaking,(ii) a profession, trade, occupation, calling, or employment, or(iii) an activity providing goods or services, whether or not for profit and however organized or formed, including a co-operative or association of persons; <p>(b) “City” means The City of Edmonton;</p> <p>(c) “City Manager” means the City’s chief administrative officer or delegate; and</p> <p>(d) “violation ticket” has the same meaning as defined in the City’s Enforcement Bylaw, Bylaw 16368.</p> |
| RULES FOR INTERPRETATION | 3 | The marginal notes and headings in this bylaw are for ease of reference only. |

PART II - PROHIBITED BUSINESSES

PROHIBITED BUSINESSES	4	No person may engage in or operate a business listed in Schedule A.
ADVERTISING	5	In a prosecution for a contravention of this bylaw, proof of one transaction in the business or that the business has been advertised is sufficient to establish that a person is engaged in or operates the business.
OFFENCE	6	A person that contravenes this bylaw is guilty of an offence.
CONTINUING OFFENCE	7	In the case of an offence that is of a continuing nature, a contravention constitutes a separate offence in respect of each day, or part of a day, on which it continues and a person guilty of such an offence is liable to a fine for each such day.
FINES	8	A person found guilty of an offence under this bylaw is liable to a fine of an amount not less than \$10,000.
VIOLATION TICKET	9	If a violation ticket is issued for an offence under this bylaw, the violation ticket may: (a) specify the fine amount established by this bylaw for the offence; or (b) require a person to appear in court without the alternative of making a voluntary payment.
	10	A person who commits an offence may, if a violation ticket is issued specifying the fine amount established by this bylaw for the offence, make a voluntary payment equal to the specified fine amount.
VICARIOUS LIABILITY	11	For the purposes of this bylaw, an act by an employee or agent of a person is deemed to be an act of the person if the act occurred in the course of the employee's employment or agency relationship with the person.
CORPORATIONS	12	If a corporation commits an offence under this bylaw, every principal, director, manager, officer, employee, or agent of the corporation who authorized, assented to, acquiesced, or participated in the act that constitutes the offence is guilty of the offence whether or not the corporation has been prosecuted for the offence.
PARTNERSHIPS	13	If a partner in a partnership is guilty of an offence under this

bylaw, each partner in the partnership who authorized, assented to, acquiesced, or participated in the act that constitutes the offence is guilty of the offence.


INSPECTIONS

SCHEDULE A - PROHIBITED BUSINESSES

Business	Prohibited Business Activity
Conversion Therapy	<p>The offering or provision of counselling or behaviour modification techniques, administration or prescription of medication, or any other purported treatment, service, or tactic used for the objective of changing a person's sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, or gender preference, or eliminating or reducing sexual attraction or sexual behaviour between persons of the same sex, not including</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="553 653 1393 758">(a) services that provide acceptance, support, or understanding of a person or that facilitate a person's coping, social support, or identity exploration or development, or<li data-bbox="553 800 1341 869">(b) gender-affirming surgery or any service related to gender-affirming surgery.
