

# **NEIGHBOURHOOD DESCRIPTION**

In 1961 the Bannerman area, along with much of present day northeast Edmonton, was annexed to the City of Edmonton. Bannerman is one of several residential neighbourhoods in the Clareview district. Edmonton City Council approved the Clareview Outline Plan in May 1972, and much of the residential land in Bannerman was developed during the 1970s.

The community's educational and recreation facilities are conveniently located at the centre of the neighbourhood. Interior residential streets are designed to provide efficient traffic flow to and from Bannerman. A variety of commercial businesses are located at Clareview Town Centre on Victoria Trail, while a LRT station is located north of 137th Avenue.

The neighbourhood was named after local businessman H. Bannerman who settled in the Belmont area in 1883. Mr. Bannerman served on the Belmont School Board.
