



NEIGHBOURHOOD DESCRIPTION

Callingwood South is a unique neighbourhood because almost all residential units are located in multi-unit structures, and it is a higher density neighbourhood as a result.

Residents of Callingwood South and surrounding neighbourhoods are served by a very high concentration of businesses and commercial services. Callingwood South is bounded by arterial roads on all four sides. These roads provide good access to the west and southwest parts of the city. At the centre of the neighbourhood is a multi-purpose educational and recreation site. Callingwood Park and Recreation Centre are conveniently located north of 69th Avenue in Callingwood North.

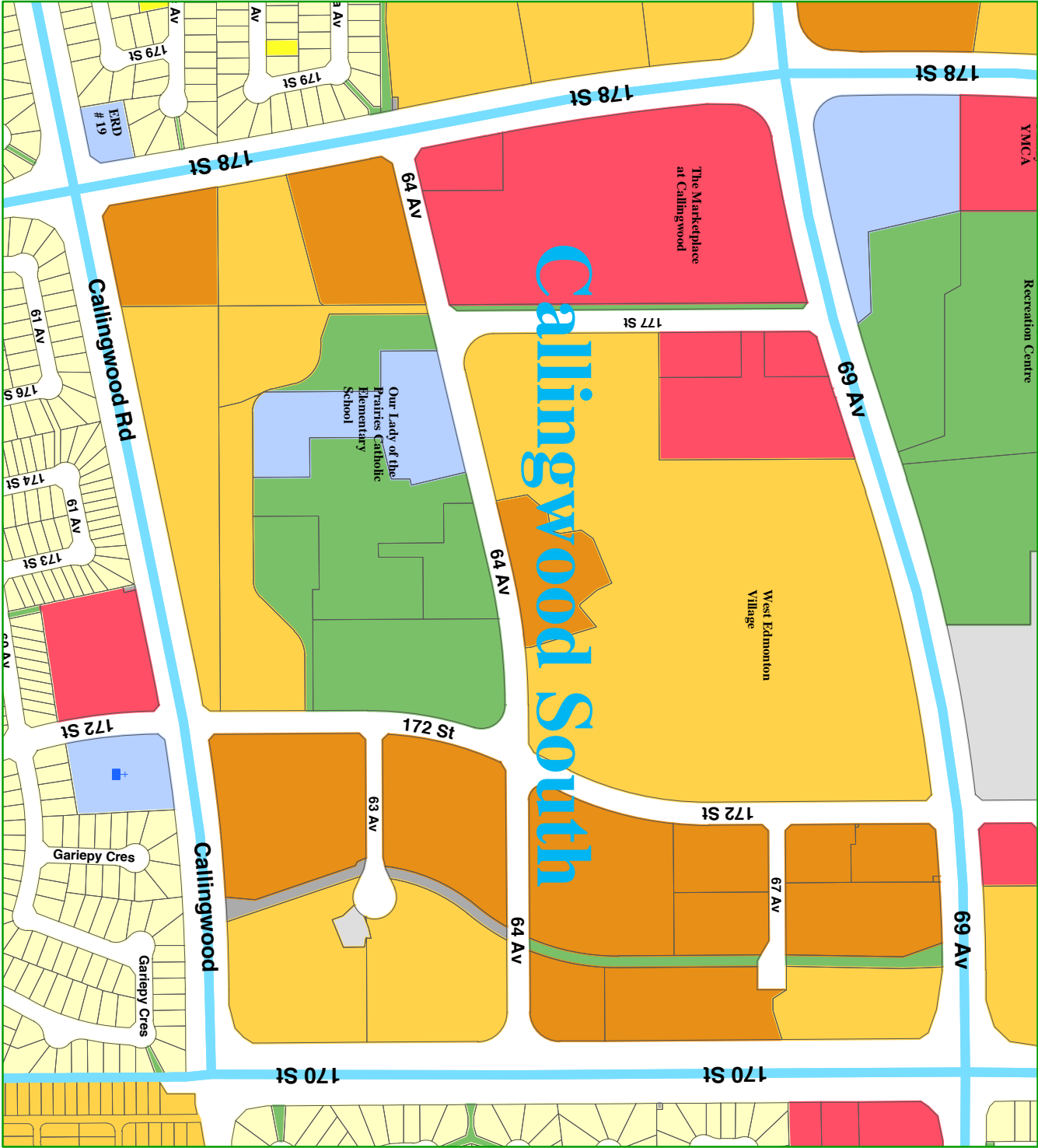
