

NEIGHBOURHOOD DESCRIPTION

The Baturyn neighbourhood is located within the northeast corner of the Castle Downs area. Baturyn is a predominantly low density residential neighbourhood, with mostly single and semi-detached homes, and a few row houses and low rise apartments. The homes are oriented along an internal curvilinear road network which features loops and cul-de-sacs that connect with a main collector roadway. The neighbourhood is accessible via both Castle Downs Road and 112th Street, and the road network was configured to provide residents with a private and quiet internal roadway system buffered from the busier arterial roadways which surround it.

A large school and park site is located at the centre of the community. The neighbourhood also includes two smaller parks in the eastern and western sides of the neighbourhood.

As one of the neighbourhoods in the Castle Downs neighbourhood, Baturyn is named for a castle. Baturyn was a famous castle in northeast Ukraine, which was destroyed by Russian troops in 1708 and rebuilt some 42 years later.
