## **Citation Awards**

The City of Edmonton has earned its reputation as the City of Volunteers. Every facet of life in our city is enriched by the dedication of its citizens in arts and culture, community service, and sports.

Citation Awards honour those individuals or groups who have given significant service and inspiring leadership in these areas.

## (1) April Dean Arts and Culture



April Dean is a visual artist who maintains a diverse studio practice encompassing printmaking and inter-media. Her acclaimed work has been part of solo and group exhibitions since 2002, including the Canada and Japan International Print Exhibition. A patron of the arts community, she has made outstanding achievements as an arts administrator, balancing her artistic practice

with teaching printmaking at the University of Alberta. As executive director of the Society of Northern Alberta Print-Artists (SNAP), she revitalized the organization through skillful administration, community engagement, and diverse programming. Dean has made a significant impact as an artist, mentor, and advocate, supporting printmaking in local, national, and international forums.

## (2) Norma Dunning Arts and Culture



Norma Dunning is an accomplished author, scholar, and researcher, as well as a volunteer and activist. In 2017 the University of Alberta Press published Dunning's first fiction collection, *Annie Muktuk and Other Stories*, a book that explores what it means to be Inuit. Reflecting sensitivity and empowerment, this stellar title has received enthusiastic reviews and attention

on national and international stages. Dunning works to support emerging writers, particularly those in marginalized positions. She is a mentor to many Indigenous young people. Her community engagement includes conducting poetry workshops with youth from various cultures and backgrounds at iHuman, through the Edmonton Poetry Festival, as well as a poetry workshop series at Boyle Street Communities Services.



# (3) Charu Ranjan Community Service



Charu Ranjan is a passionate volunteer and inspirational role model, especially to youth and women. The vice president of programs for the Council of India Societies of Edmonton, her extensive work in education and multiculturalism has included serving as president of the Hindu Society of Alberta, the Ragamala Music Society, and the Alberta Hindi Association. An integral

member of the Maanaw Seva Association for more than 20 years, Ranjan has raised funds for education in the Edmonton area, as well as in India and areas around the world experiencing disasters. Passionate about helping newcomers, she has taught Hindi to children and adults for more than 25 years.

## (4) Steven Csorba Community Service



Steven Csorba is an artist and passionate community builder who has devoted more than 20 years to helping make others strong. He created an authentic way to tell the story of the iHuman Youth Society while leading corporate sponsors to help build a safe place for endangered youth. While juggling every aspect of iHuman's renovation project, he still

volunteered dozens of extra hours each week. Despite a long battle with cancer, he energized the organization and inspired others. An advocate for cancer prevention, Csorba also volunteers with November Project Canada, a free fitness movement in Edmonton. He often delivers motivational talks about self-empowered health care, promoting resiliency and hope.

# (5) Harold Hornig Community Service



Harold Hornig is a skilled organizer who has touched countless lives through his volunteer work in arts, education, sports, and mental health. His many roles include president of the Terwillegar Performing Arts Society, president of his homeowners' association, and former board member of the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues. Hornig was a founding

member of the Terwillegar Riverbend Advisory Council, which led to building a new recreation centre. His leadership with the Mysterious Barricades Concert Society has brought hope and healing, through an annual Canada-wide music event on World Suicide Prevention Day. Chairing casinos for arts, schools, and other groups, Hornig has helped raise more than a million dollars.

# (6) Dr. Marilyn J. Hundleby Community Service



Dr. Marilyn Hundleby has touched thousands of lives both through professional care and an outpouring of personal time. After working at the Cross Cancer Institute, as well as with Canadian military personnel suffering from PTSD, she realized Edmonton had a growing need for non-medical support. Embracing the arts as a healing concept, Hundleby envisioned

a world-class support centre, embracing the body, mind, and soul, with a focus on families experiencing cancer. After 10 years of tireless effort, Dr. Hundleby and her team opened Wellspring in January 2017. Thanks to her inspirational efforts, this multimillion dollar facility provides services at no charge, ensuring no one has to face cancer alone.

## Community Service



Kathryn Kammermayer shows her love of community by working to make it an enriching and safe place to live. Serving on the Callingwood-Lymburn Community League board of directors and in the community for the past 20 years, she has held multiple positions and drafted policies and procedures that keep the league running like a business.

Kammermayer chairs bingos and devotes thousands of hours to run Kites Over Callingwood, Family Day Skate, and other events. Also a volunteer with St. Alphonsus School, she helped establish the Friends of St. Alphonsus Society and was instrumental in helping raise funds and coordinate the building of their new playground.

## (8) Bernadette (Bernie) Kollman Community Service



Bernie Kollman is dedicated to building a stronger community, both economically and socially. Her many contributions include serving as chair/cofounder of the IBM Alberta Centre for Advanced Studies, chair/board member of the Edmonton Chamber of Commerce, and campaign chair/board member of the United Way of Alberta Capital Region. She led the

2007 United Way fundraising campaign, reaching its highest financial achievement at that time. Kollman also founded and served as 10-year chair of an initiative to encourage young women to study higher levels of math and science, and pursue careers in information technology. Involved in numerous other community events and charitable initiatives, Kollman's exemplary contributions have enriched the city of Edmonton.



# (9) Dr. G.F. MacDonald Community Service



Dr. Fred MacDonald was a pioneer in establishing the subspecialty of pulmonary medicine in Edmonton. Instrumental in building the Center for Lung Health at the Edmonton General, his visionary leadership established a multidisciplinary pulmonary clinic that led to innovations in rehabilitation. Compassionate and committed, MacDonald recognized the

need to deliver services to rural areas. He developed the Breathe Easy Telehealth Pulmonary Rehabilitation Program, allowing rural patients to access specialists via teleconferencing. It is the largest rehabilitation program in Canada and the recipient of national and international attention. MacDonald's outstanding service has significantly improved the quality of life for patients in Edmonton and rural communities.

## (10/91) Trish Quinney Sports



Trish Quinney is a champion gymnast who has worked tirelessly to grow gymnastics in Edmonton. Owner of the Phoenix Gymnastics Centre, she has coached nationally since 1992, and internationally since 1994. Active with the Alberta Gymnastics Federation and Gymnastics Canada since 1989, she is currently a national judge and National Coaching Certification

Program course developer. As director of the 2000 and 2002 Trampoline & Tumbling World Cups, she provided many important opportunities for athletes and coaches. Quinney runs a recreational gymnastics program, which impacts more than 5000 athletes annually. Her outstanding coaching ability and rapport with athletes has impacted gymnasts both in Edmonton and on the world stage.

## (11) Rob Swart Sports



Rob Swart has been an extraordinary contributor to the Edmonton Rowing Club, serving as president for 11 of his 12 years of dedicated service. An architect, Swart brought an invaluable skill set to the club. He led a multimillion-dollar effort to upgrade key infrastructure, including building a new boathouse, a new dock access, and renovating

an indoor training facility, all while competing in the masters program. Swart made significant strides in programming, reaching beyond the membership to deliver public and student programs. His commitment and vision have led to the sport's growth and enriched life for today's participants, as well as future Edmonton rowers.
