Community Safety and Well-being 2022 Grant

Community leaders and organizations that have a program, service, project, event or initiative that can help advance community safety and well-being in Edmonton are encouraged to apply for up to \$100,000 in one-time grant funding support. A total of \$1.5 million will be allocated by the end of 2022.

Applications will be accepted until 11:59 p.m. September 12, 2022. Successful applicants will be notified by email that their application has been approved by October 4, 2022.

Recipients of a 2022 Community Safety and Well-being Grant will be required to complete a final report outlining the results and outcomes achieved as part of the grant's terms and conditions. Recipients may also be requested for status/progress updates. Additional details will be shared with successful applicants.

This application should take approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.

Application Instructions

Please answer all questions to the best of your ability. Upon submitting an application, any missed questions will require a response before your submission is accepted. If a question is not relevant to your application simply answer 'No' or "not applicable" to ensure that all questions provided have a response.
