Alley Renewal

- + Alley Renewal is a city-funded capital program that renews alley infrastructure on a neighbourhood-wide basis
- + Locations are chosen based on alley condition and alignment with planned utility work
- + 1,200 kilometres of alleys will be renewed in Edmonton over 25 years
- + The program is funded by a city-wide Neighbourhood Renewal Tax Levy, rather than a contribution from property owners with back alleys

Alley Renewal: What's included

- + Removing the existing alley pavement structure then reconstructing with a new base and hard surface to meet current design standards
- + Improving surface drainage, where possible
- + Upgrading existing alley lighting to LED fixtures
- + Providing wider alley entry/exit points for larger vehicles (garbage trucks), where possible
- + Pruning alley trees and shrubs ahead of construction
- + Exploring minor enhancements to improve connections for those who walk, bike or roll, where possible



Alley Renewal: What's NOT included

- + **Utility work** – While utility work is separate from the Alley Renewal program, the City works closely with utility partners to coordinate construction activities
- + **New alley lighting** – If alleys are without lighting, property owners can petition and fund new lighting in their alleys through the Local Improvement process
- + **Private property enhancements** – Any additional work on private properties such as paving personal driveways or pathways
 - + Infrastructure impacts to private property will be repaired/replaced on a like-for-like basis

Preparing for construction

- + Utility inspections and repairs
 - + Utility partners ensure required repairs are completed prior to alley construction, when possible
 - + May include drilling small holes to check for utility locations
- + Land surveys
 - + May include flags and paint markings
- + Pruning and removing trees, hedges and shrubs by professional arborists (tree specialists)
 - + Provides clearance for construction and automated waste collection
 - + Avoids future conflicts with overhead utility lines
 - + Property owners will be consulted if pruning is extensive or if a private tree requires removal. There is no cost to property owners



What to expect during construction

- + No alley access or parking for approximately four weeks
 - + Please let us know about any accessibility concerns
- + Waste collection will be temporarily moved to your front street

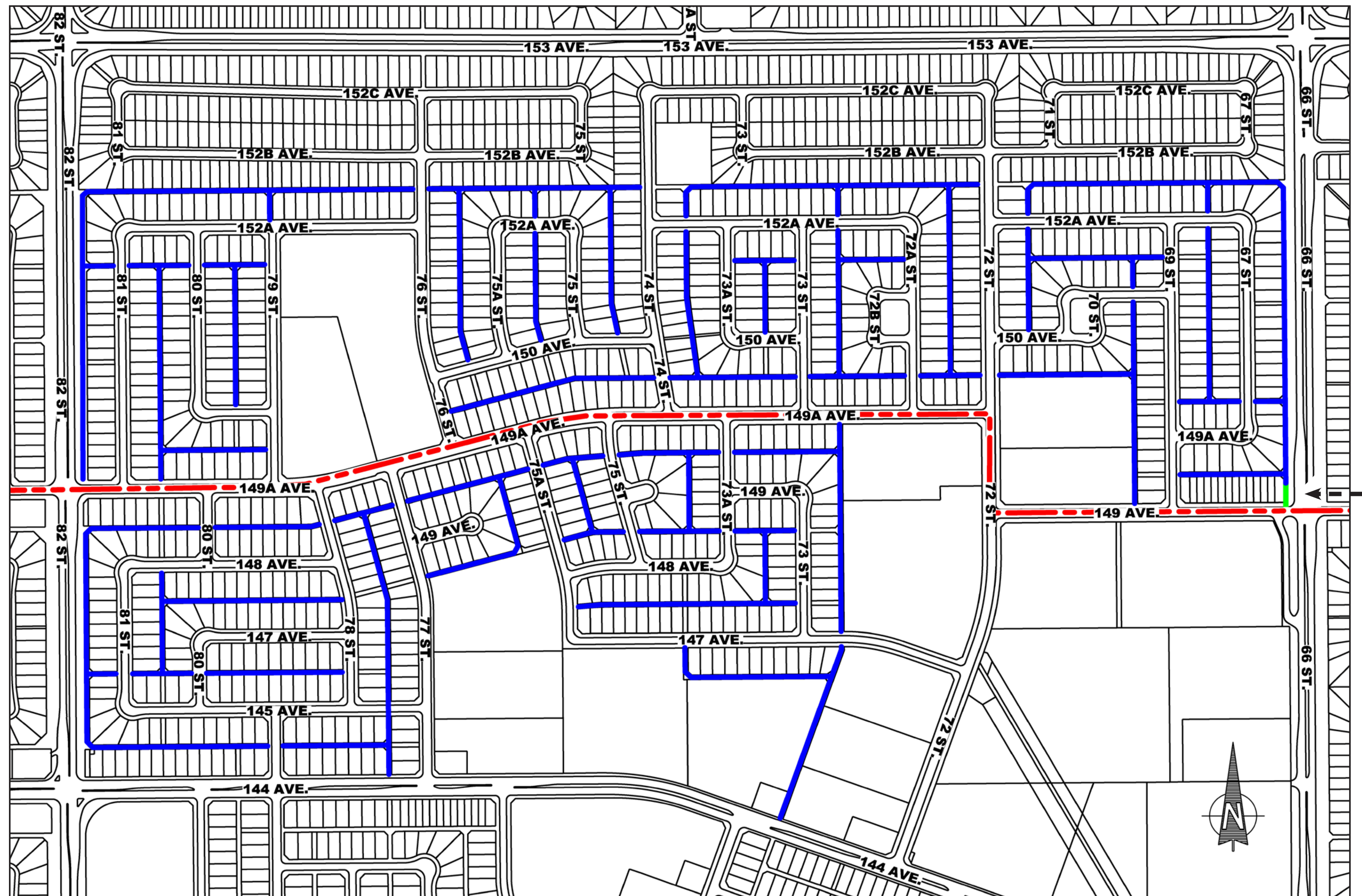

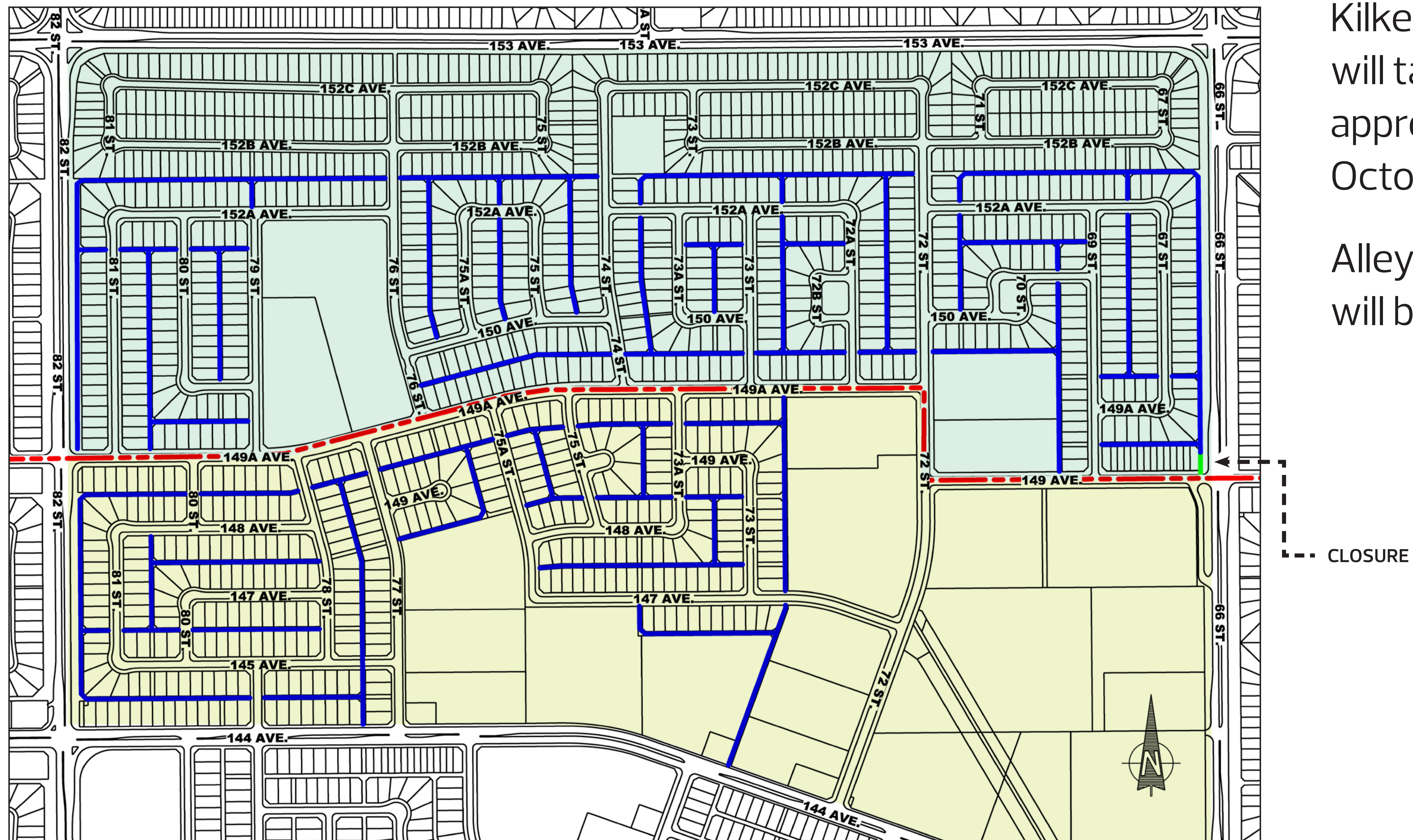
CLOSURE - - -

In fall 2022, the Kilkenny Alley Renewal Project Team proposed short sidewalk connections between select alleys and nearby arterial road bus stops on 66 Street and 82 Street. Funding for potential sidewalk improvements in Kilkenny is still being confirmed. An update will be provided on the project webpage once available.

- + Alleys (blue) will be renewed
- + Alley closure (green) to improve safety due to close proximity to a major intersection
- + Funding is still being confirmed for new sidewalks proposed to improve connections between alleys and bus stops on 66 Street and 82 Street

Construction staging

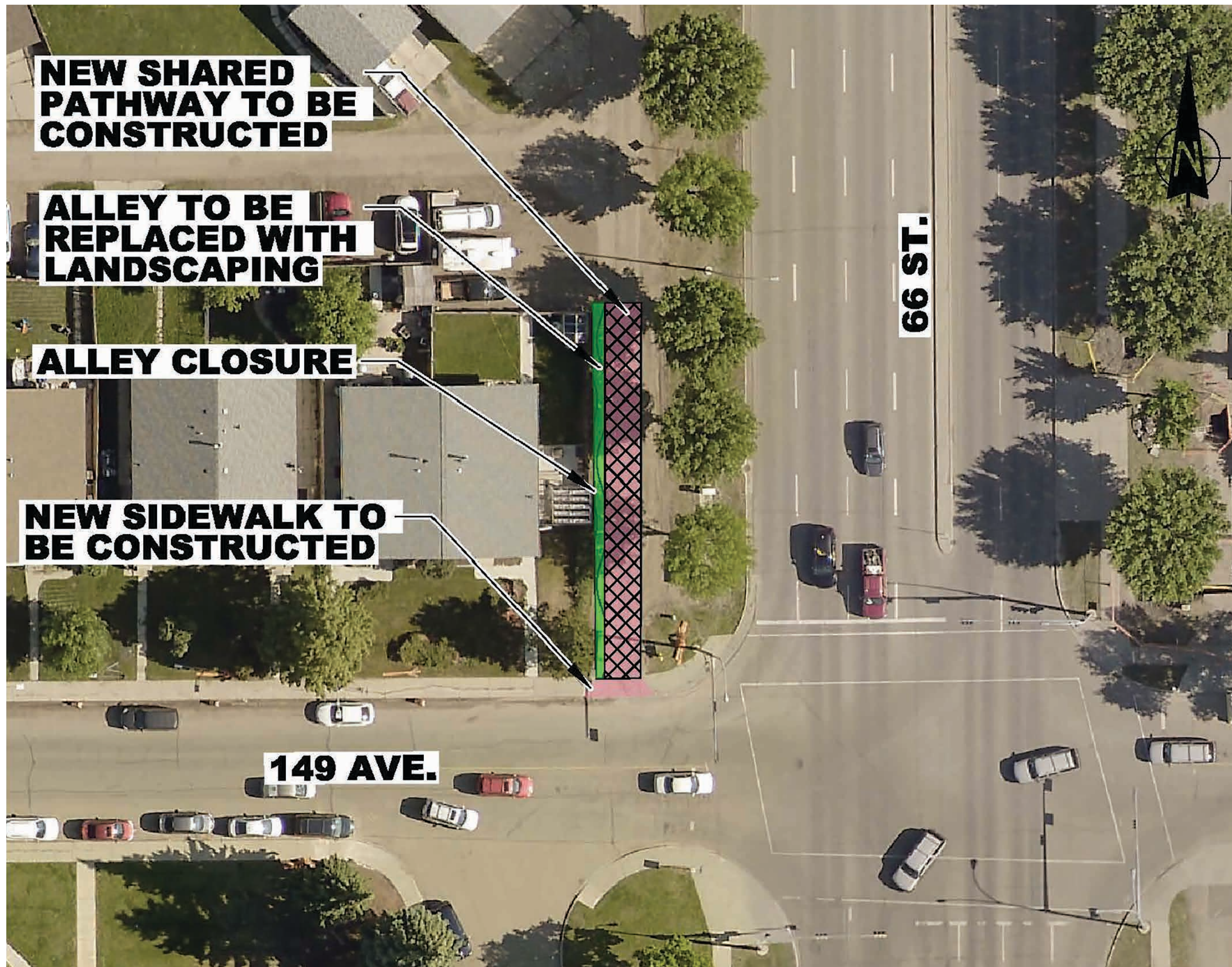
