#### c. City of Edmonton Presentations from District Planning:

- Christine recommended for the City of Edmonton's <u>District Planning</u> to attend the June WAVE meeting if there are no presentations and if there is time on the meeting agenda. Christine asked if there is no time on the agenda, if would be good for everyone that she set up a separate time for District Planning to to present to WAVE and those who are available on the Committee attend to share their feedback or ask any questions
- C. Rutherford asked if the Zoning bylaw area came to consult with WAVE. Zoning bylaw did not reach out the WAVE
- C. Rutherford explained District Planning is and how it encompasses the City Plan, Transit Plan- zoning rules how we build
- District planning looks at City in sections, central district, NW district, etc. and plan how to build communities within communities, infrastructure, help with understanding where we should put recreation centres, amenities



- The projects that District Planning are currently focusing on are: Mass Transit, River Valley Planning Modernization, and Digital Signage
- Councillor Wright noted that there was Public feedback for the Zoning Bylaw, they are writing a paper on equity and there will be a Public hearing in October so there is still time to provide feedback

     Transparency and lack of communication has been an issue and not sure if can contribute in a meaningful way, collective leadership model, need to look at what is working and not working, what are the objectives
  - Is it a situation where the workload is too much and how can we address it? Shorter terms, considering a co-chair model, utilizing the executive committee to help the work of the Chair/Vice chair
  - Consider co-chair model for the Committee, incorporate ways of making decisions - circles, improving decision making
  - Robert Rules are we using it properly? Is there way to have better consensus building at our meetings, confusion on Chair, Vice Chair or Co-Chair, we need to address burnout and also approaching members who are not as busy on WAVE to help with the work
- Action: Funmi will take feedback to the Executive Committee and have a discussion on how to approach WAVE's governance and what ideas to consider implementing
