 - a. MacEwan University Practicum Student Starting in January, Zach Johanntges
 - i. Zach will start on January 11th, 2023
 - He is coming to get experience working with WAVE, Youth Council, and AAC

 - There is a possibility of Parados taking over social media for all of the advisory committees under a single contract; we will know by the end of January and if that transition will be taking place
