



Wellington Bridge Replacement Project Transit Service Adjustments Information Sheet

Starting the week of September 15, work will begin to replace the Wellington Bridge on 102 Avenue between 132 Street and 130 Street in the Glenora neighbourhood. This work is expected to finish in fall 2026 and will result in the full closure of 102 Avenue between Churchill Crescent and Wellington Crescent.

Transit Service Adjustments

While 102 Avenue is completely closed, [Route 2](#) will be on detour via 124 Street, 107 Avenue, and 142 Street, serving all stops along its detour route. Riders can access transit on 124 Street or 142 Street or use temporary On Demand Transit service to either of these corridors from select bus stops along 102 Avenue.

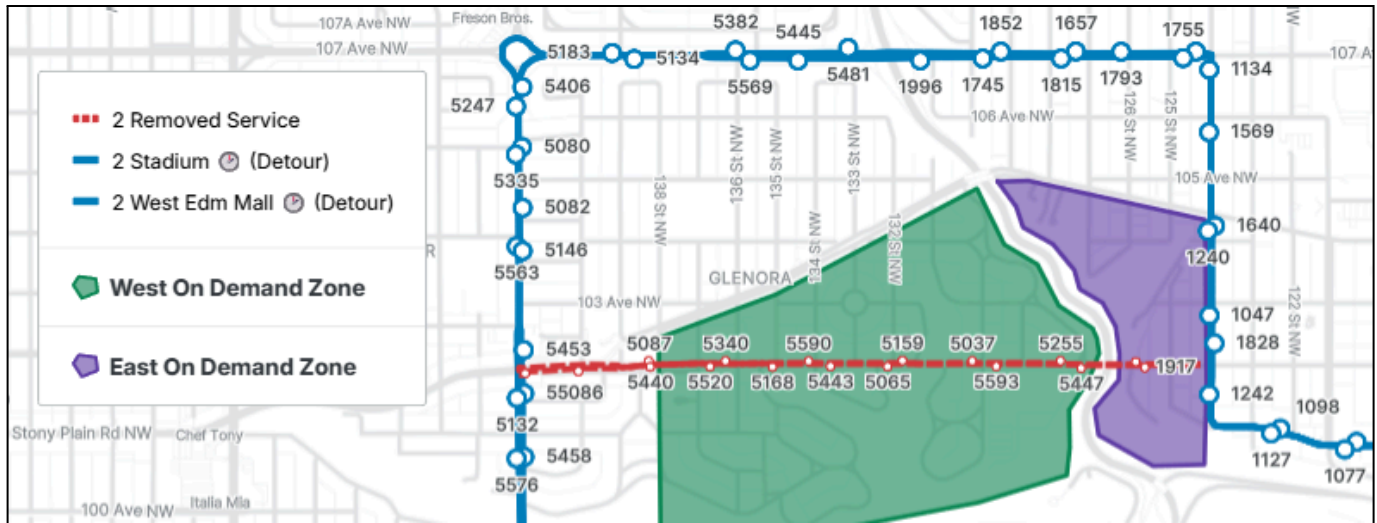

On Demand Transit

Residents can also book On Demand Transit trips that will take them from an existing Route 2 bus stop on 102 Avenue to either 142 Street or 124 Street. Riders can then transfer to conventional transit service. On Demand buses are accessible for riders with limited mobility and include child-friendly seats. Service hours are Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. - 7 p.m. and weekends and holidays from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

To book a trip, riders can phone the call centre at 780-496-2400, use the website, or book through the Edmonton On Demand Transit app. Download the app through Google Play or Apple App Store.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why isn't Route 2 being detoured to Stony Plain Road?

Although the road is open, Stony Plain Road is still an active construction site with frequent closures of the road for various construction activities for Valley Line West. To avoid confusion, a consistent detour route and schedule is preferable for riders.

The service hours of the On Demand Service are not adequate for me

While ETS acknowledges this temporary On Demand Transit service's operating hours are less than the neighbourhood service, ETS is also committed to monitoring and making adjustments to meet demand. Feedback can also be provided through ETS' online form: edmonton.ca/TransitFeedback.

Will Dedicated Accessible Transit Service (DATS) still be available during construction?

Yes. Since DATS uses smaller buses, more similar in size to a van or truck, they will still be able to provide door to door service for DATS riders living in Glenora.
