124 Street Renewal

Planning and design is underway for renewing 124 Street! 111 Avenue - 118 Avenue will be renewed including road reconstruction, replacement of street lights, curb and gutters and repairing sidewalks. 109 Avenue to 111 Avenue will also be repaved as a part of this project.

Cost sharing opportunities will be made available through the Local Improvement process for decorative street light upgrades. Other opportunities to improve connections and public spaces for year-round use will also be explored.

To meet the needs of area residents and businesses, we need your input on amenities including lighting, beautification, streetscaping, winter use and historical design elements.

What's been decided:

- No change to existing number of lanes
- Maintain current off-peak on-street parking
- No curb extensions into 124 Street
- Bus stops north of 114 Avenue will be removed as part of the Bus Network Redesign

What needs further technical evaluation and public input:

- Pedestrian crossings
- Street lights
- Gathering spaces
- Streetscaping elements
- 124 Street historical elements
- Landscaping and greening



Get involved, stay informed!

Now is the time to get involved as we continue to plan and design 124 Street to meet your needs. Building off the public input we heard in the Strategy Phase in 2018-2019, we are inviting you to share your voice to help shape the design of 124 Street for now and the future. Working together, we can achieve outcomes that meet your expectations.

The City recognizes each Edmonton area is unique. To ensure a solid understanding of what is important to residents and visitors to 124 Street, we will engage with a broad and inclusive lens to understand how you live, work, play and travel along 124 Street through the Inglewood neighbourhood.

We have created a road map (right) to help you understand the steps of the renewal process and how you can participate. At each step we will tell you what the purpose is and how your input will inform the decisions being made. We commit to report back on how we used your input.



Decorative street lights

As part of 124 Street renewal, standard street lights will be replaced. The cost of the standard street light is paid by the City. However, property owners have the opportunity to upgrade to decorative street lights. The upgrade from standard to decorative street lights is a community-initiated local improvement and carries an additional cost to property owners.

If the community or a sub-group would like to pursue a local improvement for decorative street lighting, the community submission including which decorative lighting option for consideration needs to be submitted to the City by July 2, 2020.
