

Beginning in spring 2022, Killarney will experience neighbourhood renewal. The Neighbourhood Renewal program will rehabilitate roads, curbs and gutters, replace street lights, repair sidewalks and connect missing sidewalk links where possible. Costsharing opportunities will be made available through the Local Improvement process for sidewalk reconstruction and decorative street light upgrades in the neighbourhood. In addition to roadways, the City may also explore improvements to parks and City-owned green spaces and look for opportunities to enhance the neighbourhood in coordination with other City projects.

This newsletter intends to keep you informed of the neighbourhood renewal in Killarney, and when and how you can join the conversation.

We will continue to invite you to participate in a variety of ways, then we will share what we heard from you and your neighbours, and how the information was used to inform the design.

Exploring Options and Trade-Offs

Since the launch of Killarney's Neighbourhood Renewal in September 2019, the project team has been gathering local knowledge, understanding technical constraints, opportunities and reviewing City policies and programs.

Coming up next in the Killarney Renewal project, we will explore design options for the neighbourhood that consider issues and opportunities identified by the community. We will explain and discuss any associated benefits and trade-offs of the design options, and gather your feedback and ideas to be considered as we move toward a draft design.

As we enter the Exploring Options and Trade-Offs phase of Killarney's neighbourhood renewal, we will be hosting several online sessions to provide information and get your feedback. Project team members will walk through options for driving and traffic calming, bike routes and facility types, walking connections and new sidewalks, and parks and open spaces. 
How decisions are made

Technical requirements – what infrastructure best meets the area's needs, where it can fit and what impacts it will have to the immediate and surrounding area

City policies and programs – how City initiatives and activities are implemented

Public input – local knowledge of the community
