## What is traffic calming?

+ Traffic calming uses physical traffic measures that aim to reduce speeding or shortcutting traffic on residential roads within communities.
+ Measures are usually used in combination to address issues along a corridor or over a larger area
+ There are opportunities to consider traffic calming to reduce speeding and shortcutting in Calder.


## What we heard

Traffic calming measures would help to improve safety and comfort for people who walk, people who drive and people who bike in Calder. Participants identified the following traffic concerns:

+ Shortcutting and fast moving vehicles occur on some roads in the neighbourhood
+ Vehicles travel fast along 129 Avenue and along 121 Street.
+ Shortcutting is experienced on 115 Street, 116 Street, 120 Street and 126 Street
+ Pedestrians feel unsafe at some crossings in Calder.
