

# Worried about whether a cat in your neighbourhood is lost and has a home?

Paper collars are a great way to check if the cat you are worried about has a home.


If you are certain that a cat is lost, you can place this paper collar on it and let it back into the neighbourhood. Once the cat is wearing the collar, please do not let the cat in your home or feed it for at least a 48 hour period. This will encourage the cat to find its way back to its owner or where it is known.

A cat in reasonable condition will not be harmed by lack of food for this period.

If the cat is injured, in distress or unhealthy or meet any of the other criteria for immediate intake, please call 311 or bring the cat into the Animal Care & Control Centre (13550 163 St NW).
