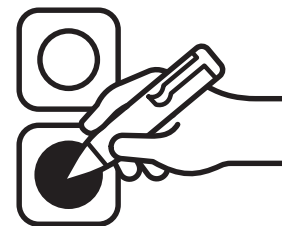


Instructions for Electors

How to Mark a Ballot

To vote, using only the pen provided, fill in the oval that indicates your choice, like this:



To Vote

Mark each ballot by filling in the circle on the right hand side, opposite of the name of the candidate(s) of your choice. The ballot indicates the maximum number of candidates that can be voted for in each race. You may vote for less than the maximum number indicated for each race, **but not for more**.

After Marking your Ballot(s)

Bring the ballot(s) to the deputy supervising the voting tabulator. The deputy will, after verifying the initials on the ballot(s), assist you in depositing the ballot into the voting tabulator and ballot box.

Referendum Question Ballot

In the case of a ballot for a bylaw or question, mark the ballot by filling the circle opposite either "Yes" or "No".

Insert each of your ballots into a separate secrecy sleeve so that your markings are concealed and the initials of the deputy who issued the ballot(s) are visible.

Spoiled Ballot(s)

If you have marked your ballot in error, or defaced it in any way, you may return it and obtain a replacement from the deputy who gave it to you.

If a ballot is torn, defaced or otherwise dealt with by an elector so that the elector can be identified, the ballot is rejected and shall not be counted.



A person may vote only once



It is an offence to take a ballot out of a voting station.
