BETTER INFORM RESIDENTS ON HOW THEY CAN EFFECTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN THE PLANNING PROCESS

Over the past several years, the City has produced a suite of infill-related education materials and resources to support residents. A review of these materials is currently underway to ensure they continue to meet resident needs. Focus groups were held with citizens to gather feedback on these materials, and to identify other opportunities to better inform residents on how to effectively participate in the infill development process.

In addition, in November 2019, the Customer Oriented Website Enhancement (COWE) project was completed. The goal of this project was to improve the planning and development website content and navigation for ease of use.

The Infill Liaison Team continues to provide in-person support for residents wishing to participate in infill conversations. This action will continue until the conclusion of the Infill Roadmap in 2022.

INCENTIVIZE ACCESSIBLE LANEWAY HOMES

On February 25 2019 amendments to Edmonton's Zoning Bylaw were passed to remove regulatory barriers to inclusive design for garden suites and to incentive accessible suites.

CREATE A MAP OF OPTIMAL LOCATIONS FOR INFILL

The project team is in the process of data collection and identifying indicators required for the mapping tool that will identify sites best-suited for mixed use, medium and high density residential development

This action is set to be complete by the end of year 2020.

Action 12

REDUCE BARRIERS TO USE OF LOW IMPACT DEVELOPMENT

Preliminary fact-finding discussions are underway with stakeholders and industry leaders and partners to identify issues and opportunities for reducing barriers to Low Impact Development (LID) practice for low and medium scale infill.

This action is set to be complete by 2022.
