Safe Voting

The safety of election workers and voters is a top priority.

- Large voting stations
- Physical distancing
- Plexiglass barriers
- Masking is mandatory for all workers, voters and visitors to voting stations
- Pre-screening for election workers
- Hand sanitizer
- Enhanced sanitization of the voting station
- More opportunities to vote in advance
- Managed line ups

Edmonton Elections is prepared to deliver a safe election.

Voting Opportunities

Advance Vote

- 12 Advance Vote locations (October 4-13)
- 4 Advance Vote post secondary schools (October 4-7)
- Institutional voting stations (Senior Accommodation Facilities Oct 4-8, 12-13)

Election Day

- 212 voting stations
- Institutional voting stations

Special Ballots

- Applications available until Election Day at 4:30pm

Rules for Candidates, official agents and scrutineers

Reminders

- No campaigning in and around a voting station
- Cannot obstruct or interfere in voting process
- Not be allowed to enter, if a candidate is present
- Follow all health and safety protocols

Voting Station Access

- Official agents and scrutineers must submit Form 16.
- Check in with Presiding Deputy upon arrival.
- Only one person per candidate permitted at a given time.

After Voting Stations Have Closed

Advance Voting	Election Day
1 candidate, official agent or scrutineer may remain in the voting station	1 candidate, official agent or scrutineer may remain in the voting station
You may sign the ballot accounting form completed by the Presiding Deputy, if desired.	You may sign the ballot accounting form completed by the Presiding Deputy, if desired.
Results are not available until Election Day.	One results tape from the tabulator will be printed and posted in the voting station.

What to Expect at the Count Centre

- Election Night (October 18) starting at 8pm
- Includes special ballots, ballots from institutional voting stations and Advance Vote tabulators
- Results tapes will be posted in the Count Centre
- Details will be provided via email to all candidates

- Official results will be posted at noon on October 22
