

Updates | The latest project updates to keep you in-the-know

Zoning Bylaw Renewal Initiative - Draft, draft, drafting away!

The Zoning Bylaw Renewal Team continues to work towards completing a first full draft of the New Zoning Bylaw in anticipation of public engagement beginning in September. We're continuing to write the new Zoning Bylaw, testing and refining zones and troubleshooting the new Zoning Map to make sure folks can explore what new zones are being proposed to specific properties.

We're also going full steam ahead with our engagement planning and strategizing how to capture the most meaningful feedback from a wide spectrum of stakeholders. This includes building on the lessons we learned from our virtual engagement shift in recent years.



Making Space for Land Use Public Hearings

A land use Statutory Public Hearing invites the public to speak their minds, challenge proposals and provide input into decisions about proposed land use developments and plans. For some, it can be an intimidating space with complicated processes and endless jargon.

That's why the City is introducing the Public Hearing Playbook—a step-by-step guide that simplifies Land Use Statutory Public Hearings to make sure everyone has the tools to meaningfully participate.

District General Policy

District Planning is still seeking feedback on the draft District General Policy (DGP). The City Plan describes Edmonton with a population of two million people, but that's going to take a while (we're talking decades). To make sure change is gradual, the DGP applies The City Plan's policies that are in line with current development patterns and trends to gently guide Edmonton's growth to 1.25 million strong.

Edmontonians can provide feedback through an online survey between now and the end of July, but there will be other opportunities to engage with the DGP August-October. A full engagement schedule will be available in the coming weeks.


Summer Pop-Ups
