Win Together Canada Foundation	G-Winners Empowerment and Violence Prevention Project This project formalizes a proven program by integrating entrepreneurship and financial literacy with education on healthy relationships, violence prevention, and online safety. This program will be delivered bilingually.	\$75,000.00
Norwood Child and Family Resource Centre	Strengthening Families This project expands a program offering family violence-focused parent education groups and 1:1 support, partnering for specialist access. This project uses Family Violence Protocol Screens to identify risk and connect families to resources.	\$125,000.00
Organization for the Prevention of Violence	Youth Well-Being & Support Protocol This project scales a formally-rebranded protocol (Youth Well-being Support Protocol (YWBSP)) to train staff in 5–7 new Edmonton organizations on early detection and upstream intervention for youth vulnerability, creating individualized well-being plans.	\$150,000.00
Sexual Assault Centre of Edmonton (SACE)	WiseGuyz at the Sexual Assault Centre of Edmonton (SACE) This project expands an evidence-informed, full-year healthy relationships and life skills education program for Grade 9 boys. This project focuses on challenging harmful masculine stereotypes, building emotional literacy, and developing communication and consent skills.	\$250,000.00
Dickinsfield Amity House	Strengthening Safety and Belonging in Dickensfield This project is a place-based prevention program supporting families in a high-need neighborhood. This project includes safe drop-in activities, immediate conflict resolution and violence interruption supports, family support/referrals, and youth leadership opportunities.	\$150,000.00
