



Upgrades coming to Mayfield traffic calming measures!

Improving Traffic Safety

Adaptable traffic calming measures were installed in **Mayfield** in summer 2024 to address traffic safety concerns such as speeding, shortcutting and other unsafe driving behaviours.

Opportunities to convert the installed adaptable traffic calming measures to permanent are reviewed and prioritized periodically at select locations. We’re happy to share that two speed humps in Mayfield have been selected and will be converted to permanent measures. All other traffic calming measures in the neighbourhood will remain in place.

Adaptable traffic calming measures help the City to quickly improve road safety and adjust as needed. When these measures prove effective and budget allows, they are replaced with permanent asphalt or concrete solutions for long-term durability.

Planned Upgrades

Traffic calming measures outlined in the table below will be converted to permanent measures this construction season. Installation work can be expected to begin as early as **summer 2026**, weather and resources permitting.
