

Contestant's Licensing: Application Information

Edmonton Combative Sports Bylaw #15594 requires all contestants to hold both a valid annual contestant licence and valid contestant per event licence to compete in ECSC sanctioned events. The annual licence is valid until the end of the calendar year and requires annual payment. The contestant event licence is only good for the date of the event and contestant must pay for an event licence for each and every ECSC sanctioned event they participate in.

The following outlines key details for the both licence application processes:

Contestant Annual Licence:

1. One time payment. The annual licence is good until the end of calendar year
2. An annual licence is required in order for a contestant to be listed as in "Good standing" with the ECSC
3. Licence fee is prescribed in schedule "A" of the Bylaw #15594

Contestant Annual Licence Application Requirements:

1. Applicant's name and address
2. Picture identification
3. Retirement or inactivity status
4. Email address
5. Declaration of suspension and good status with local Commission
6. Declaration of medical and suspension history
7. Acknowledgement of the ECSC Rules and regulations

Contestant Event Licence:

1. Mandatory licence required to participate in any ECSC sanctioned event
2. Contestant event licence is only good for the date of the event. A licence fee is required for every event
3. A valid annual contestant licence is a prerequisite
4. Applicants must acknowledge questions about suspension history, medical history, accurate medical information and injury reporting
5. Licence fees are prescribed in schedule "A" of Bylaw #15594
6. Event licence fees can be paid by the event promoter

Contestant Event Licence Application Requirements:

1. Applicant's name and address
2. Picture identification
3. Retirement information (if applicable)
4. ECSC Annual licence number
5. Email address
6. Promoter's information
7. Declaration of good standing with their local Commission
8. Declaration that required information was forwarded to the ECSC Chief Medical Officer
9. Declaration of accurate fight and medical history
10. Declaration of concussions or head injuries in the previous 60 days
11. Declaration of injuries in the previous 90 days
12. Acknowledgement of the ECSC Rules and regulations

Combined Licence Application

To expedite the licence application process and for the benefit of non resident contestants, a combined licence application is also available for contestants and promoters who wish to cover the contestant's event licence fees. Required information is the same as the annual and per event licence
