122 Avenue Collector Concept Plan

Overview

- ❖ 122 Avenue is a “collector” road – it collects neighbourhood traffic and disperses it to arterial roadways.
- ❖ 122 Avenue (between 107 Street and Fort Road) is anticipated for reconstruction in 2017-2018. This may include the complete removal and reconstruction of the roadway, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, bus stops and streetlights.
- ❖ Prior to reconstruction, this planning exercise will:
 - Determine how the roadway can be enhanced to meet the needs of current and future users
 - Ensure road design consistency across the five neighbourhoods it passes through
- ❖ During planning, the following will be considered:
 - Pedestrian crossings
 - Sidewalk and bus stop connections
 - Pedestrian and traffic safety
 - Speeding and shortcutting

Background

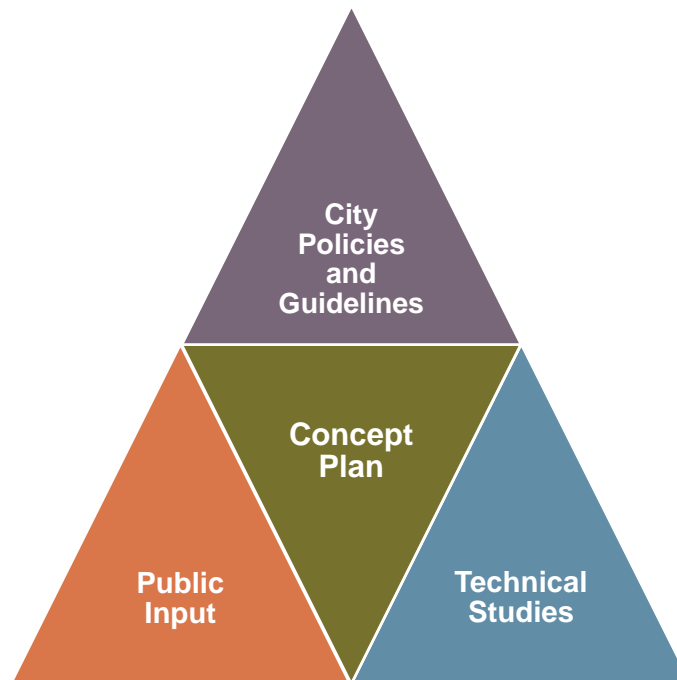
- ❖ 122 Avenue is an important east-west connection and transit corridor that provides access to five residential neighbourhoods between 107 Street and Fort Road.
- ❖ In the future, 122 Avenue may provide an indirect connection to the Blatchford urban redevelopment (via 107 Street), as well as access to the Metro Line LRT and Blatchford's amenities including a lake, parks and walking trails.

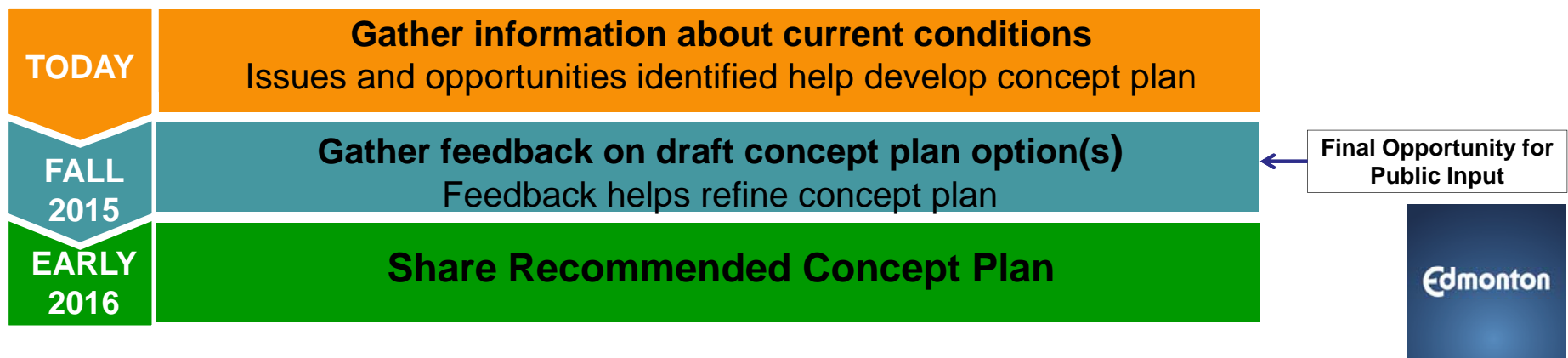

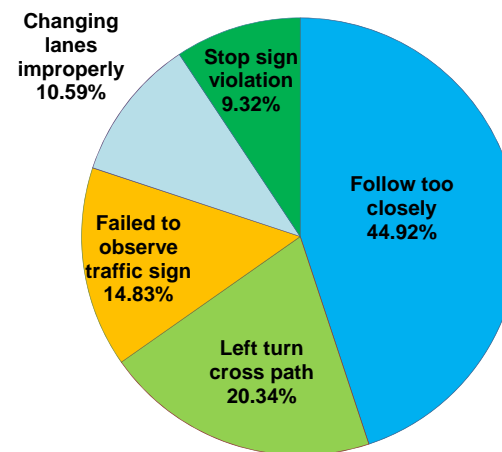
Traffic and Collision Information

- ❖ Daily traffic volumes range from 2500 to 6750 vehicles
- ❖ There were 251 collisions along the corridor between 2010 and 2014
- ❖ The cause of approximately 45% of collisions is “*followed too closely*”

2015 Daily Traffic Volumes

Number of Vehicles on 122 Avenue	In 2015
West of Fort Road	2500
West of 82 Avenue	6725
West of 97 Street	5360
West of 103 Avenue	3735

Collisions by Top 5 Causes



122 Avenue Collector Concept Plan

Current Situation

- ❖ Roadway:
 - Inconsistent roadway width
 - Inconsistent number of lanes (3 and 4 lanes)
 - Poor roadway conditions
- ❖ Other:
 - Poor sidewalk conditions
 - Inconsistent sidewalk widths
 - Non standard bus stop/shelters
 - Missing sidewalk in some locations
 - Mature trees



Considerations

- ❖ Accessibility and efficient movement of people
- ❖ Pedestrian and traffic safety
- ❖ Roadway and sidewalk widths
- ❖ Pedestrian crossings
- ❖ Sidewalk and bus stop connections
- ❖ Streetlight renewal and upgrades

Project Timeline

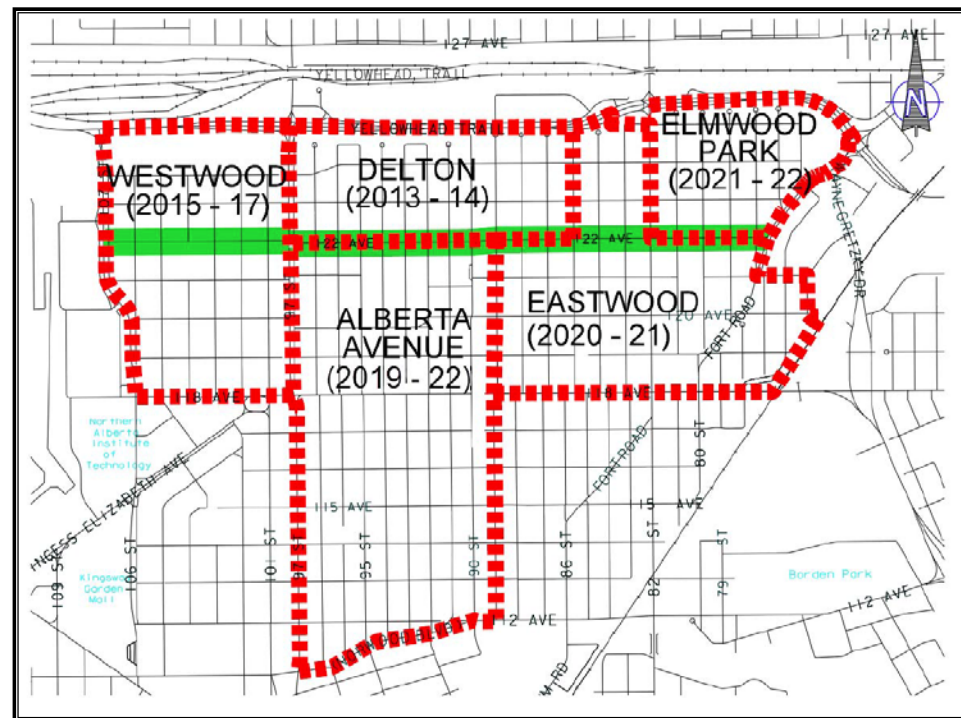
- ❖ Concept Plan Development: 2015
- ❖ Concept Plan Completion: Early 2016
- ❖ Preliminary/Detailed Design Phase: 2016-2017
- ❖ Tentative Scheduled Construction: 2017-2018



122 Avenue Collector Concept Plan

Neighbourhood Renewal Schedule

- ❖ The Neighbourhood Renewal program began with Delton in 2013 and will continue with the reconstruction of the remaining neighbourhoods through 2022 (see below).
- ❖ 122 Avenue reconstruction will be completed separately from the Neighbourhood Renewal process.
