

What We Heard

• High speeds and unsafe operation at the 139 Street / 109A Avenue/109B Avenue intersection






BRINGING OUR CITY VISION TO LIFE

What We Heard

Investigation

After further engineering analysis, initial proposed design

was not feasible






BRINGING OUR CITY VISION TO LIFE

What We Propose

- Conversion to two T-intersections
- North intersection: stop-controlled eastbound
- South intersection:3-way stop



BRINGING OUR CITY VISION TO LIFE

What We Heard

 Insufficient road width along 109A Avenue from 139 Street to 135 Street

Investigation


- Bus Route
- Significant amount of parking in front of church



BRINGING OUR CITY VISION TO LIFE

What We Propose

- Widen roadway by 1.5m to the north maximum allowable widening without impacting trees
- Provides more road width for parking on north side



BRINGING OUR CITY VISION TO LIFE

What We Heard

• Concerns about proposed narrowing of 139 Street between 107 Avenue and 109 Avenue

Investigation

- Roadway is a school bus route
- Functions more like a collector roadway

What We Propose

 Maintain existing roadway width of 11.5m
